Military Service of Riley Anderson

Riley enlisted for one year on July 31, 1861 at Livingston, Overton Co., TN, about thirty miles northeast of his home in Buffalo Valley, Putnam Co., TN. He was a Private in Co. F, 25th Tennessee Reg't which was organized August 10, 1861 by Col. Sidney S. Stanton. This unit was transferred into the Confederate States Army on October 1, 1861 at Fort Meyers. Riley was under Lt. A.B. Hardcastle.

On January 19, 1862 this unit was in the Battle of Fishing Creek, also known as Mill Springs & Logans Crossroads, on the upper Cumberland River, west of Summerset, KY. This was a fierce & bloody battle for the strategic spot, which controlled the West to East supply route. The Confederates lost this battle & all of KY. It was here that Confederate Gen't Felix K. Zollicoffer was killed in front of Riley Anderson & some others. At the Battle of Fishing Creek, KY on January 19, 1862, Riley Anderson was wounded. Riley Anderson was wounded at the Battle of Fishing Creek (Logan's Crossroads/Mill Springs), KY on the Cumberland River.

In April 1862, Riley's first cousin Prettyman Jones became commander of Company F. This was after the Battle of Fishing Creek, Puliski Co., KY.

Riley was last paid on May 1, 1863. He deserted on July 4, 1863 at Cumberland Mountain, TN, which is near LaFollette & Cumberland Gap. His cousin 'Purtyman' Jones deserted August 19, 1863 at Fort Loudon on present day I-75, south of I-40 & Oak Ridge. Prettyman later joined the Union Army & served as a Capt. as did Riley's brother Thomas Anderson. Prettyman's brother Wade Jones was made 1st Sgt. Wade Jones, his brother, Prettyman Jones and several others left the confederate army, and later joined the Union Army. Riley didn't join the Union army, he went home.

There was apparently a lot of disorganization & desertion at this time because on May 10, 1863 the 25th Regm't was reorganized and in September of 1863 it was consolidated with the 44th Regm't. During this period, the Union Army was moving from Nashville to Murfreesboro and on to Chattanooga, TN, just to the South of them, without a fight, which must have been very demoralizing.

The Jones family opposed slavery and supported the Union. Starting in 1862 large numbers of confederate soldiers started deserting. One of reasons was the plantation class had sold them on the idea that they would take care of their families and they never did. Another reason is when soldiers got into camp they saw sons of plantation owners come to camp in buggies with wagons and personal slaves and getting the best leadership positions.

According to the family knowledge, Riley was wounded but this doesn't show in his records and the surrounding circumstances are unknown. Riley purchased a farm near Boma, Putnam Co., TN and lived there until his death. In the fall of 1885 there was a flux epidemic in Mine Lick Creek area of Putnam Co., TN. Riley's two daughters, Judian "Tiny" and Mary Jane, became ill and died. They lived in a large two story log house which was torn down long after the turn of the century. After his death Michael Alexander Anderson md Whit Spivey and they separated after a short period of time. Riley's full name is not known for sure. He has appeared in records as Riley, R.W. and Riley Simpson.

Pg. 50: Chapter Seventeen: The War Between the States:

The ear, 1861 to 1865 known as the War Between the States or the Civil War, was a very momentous period in the history of our county and state. When the war was started Overton was a very large county in area, comprising a large part of Pickett and Clay Counties, as these counties were not established until after the war. In Overton County, occupied by a prosperous people and peace-loving citizenry, the people were divided and estranged into factions, many times neighbor against neighbor and sometimes brother against brother. Those who favored secession believed that the South had been grievously wronged by the North, and that the election of Abraham Lincoln as president of the USA was a fearful import to our future. Those who claimed that the State of Tennessee entered the Union possessed of all the rights of a free state and that slavery was one of these rights, and that a state had the right to secede, joined with the cause of the Confederacy and the South.

Captains: William Gooch Smith and George H. Nash, Company "C", organized July 28, 1861, at Doyle and Livingston, TN, men from Cave, now Doyle, White County.

Captains: Luther B. Myers, John M. Hughes and William H. Fleming, Company "D", organized August 1, 1861, men from Livingston, Overton County.

Captains: Joseph Shaw, Peterman (Prettyman) Jones, and G. W. Kinnaird, Company "F" organized July 31, 1861, at Livingston, men from Cookeville, Putnam County.

Captains: Leonidas A. McCarver and Albert Green, Company "G" organized July 30, 1861, at Livingston, men from Flynn's Lick, Jackson County, Tennessee.

Captains: James R. Copeland and Grandison H. Swope. Company "H" organized August 5, 1861, men from Livingston, Overton County.

Captains: Wiley J. Reed, William H. Phillips and James H. Curtis. Organized July 30, 1861, men from Putnam County, TN.

The above named companies were organized into a regiment at Camp Zollicoffer in Overton County. A few days later the regiment went into camp of instruction at camp Myers, also in Overton County, where it was mustered into Confederate service. While at Camp Myers the regiment was joined by the 28th Tennessee Infantry Regiment, under Colonel John P. Murray and two cavalry companies under Captain A. C. Sanders and Captain W. S. Bledsoe. These forces under command of Colonel Stanton, remained at and around Camp Myers until October 1861, skirmishing with home guards and Federal units along the Kentucky line north of Overton County, with one raid in Albany, KY. On October 13, Stanton and his Regiment were ordered to Bowling Green, KY, but upon pressure from the citizens of Overton County, he was ordered to delay his move to Bowling Green until he had broken up the concentration of Home Guards in his area.

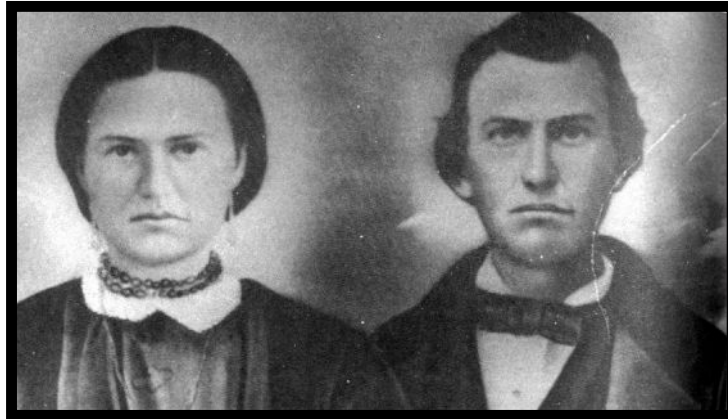
"According to regimental reports the command took up the march to Mill Springs, KY on October 1, 1861, making a detour along the Kentucky-Tennessee border, and arrived at Mill Springs, November 15, 1861.

"In the battle of Murfreesboro, December 31, Johnson's Brigade was in Major General Cleburn's Division. The 25th was commanded by Colonel Hughes, who was wounded, and later by Lieutenant Colonel Samuel Davis. It suffered 120 casualties out of 336 engaged, including 12 officers out of 37.

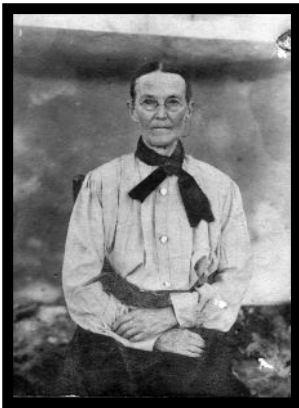
"At the Battle of Fishing Creek, January 19, 1862, the 25th was in Zollicoffer's Brigade. Here the 25th lost 55 men. Colonel Stanton was wounded.

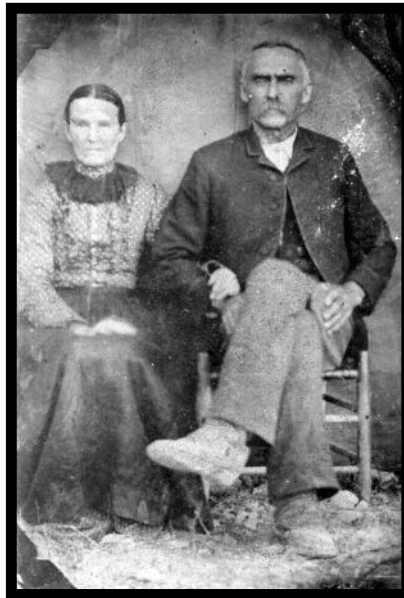

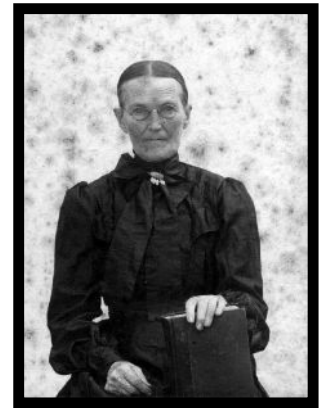

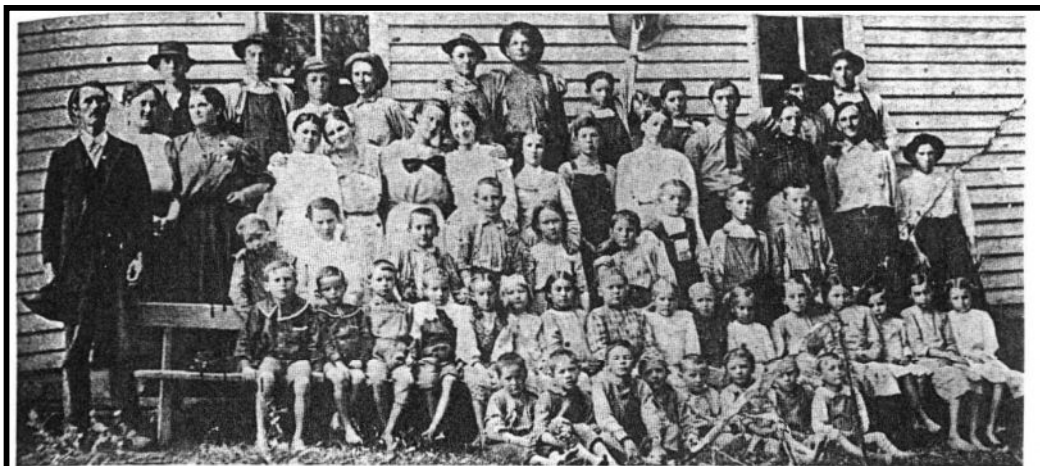

Riley & Micheal Elizabeth (Alexander) Anderson had two daughters– **Judian “Tiny”** b. 23 February 1878 & **Mary Jane** b. 7 January 1879

The girls died a day apart on 3rd & 4th of October 1885 – from the flux epidemic in Mine Lick Creek area of Putnam Co. Riley Anderson died a month later from the flux and was buried a few hundred feet from their home, a large two story log cabin, on their farm near Boma, Putnam Co., TN. Riley Anderson was buried next to his grandson, John Byrd Anderson, s/o Lewis Monroe Anderson & Matilda Isabelle Wallace who died, 13 March 1894. The graves were moved to Smellage Cemetery, Boma, Putnam Co., TN at a later date. The log cabin was in good condition when it was torn down to make way for another building.

Margaret Maddux the wife of James Anderson. Margaret was the mother of Forrest, Donald, Howard, Elizabeth & (Twin) Donald. She was the daughter of Elizabeth (Brown) Maddux & George Maddux. Elizabeth (Brown) Maddux was the daughter of Ruth Shamblin (Jared) Brown & Martin Brown. Ruth Shamblin (Jared) Brown was the daughter of William & Elizabeth (Raulsten) Jared. Ruth married Martin Brown 24 November 1825. Ruth Shamblin (Jared) Brown (William Jared 2, John 1).

Riley & Micheal Elizabeth (Alexander) Anderson had two daughters– **Judian "Tiny"** b. 23 February 1878 & **Mary Jane** b. 7 January 1879

The girls died a day apart on 3rd & 4th of October 1885 – from the flux epidemic in Mine Lick Creek area of Putnam Co. Riley Anderson died a month later from the flux and was buried a few hundred feet from their home, a large two story log cabin, on their farm near Boma, Putnam Co., TN. Riley Anderson was buried next to his grandson, John Byrd Anderson, s/o Lewis Monroe Anderson & Matilda Isabelle Wallace who died, 13 March 1894. The graves were moved to Smellage Cemetery, Boma, Putnam Co., TN at a later date. The log cabin was in good condition when it was torn down to make way for another building.

Margaret Maddux the wife of James Anderson. Margaret was the mother of Forrest, Donald, Howard, Elizabeth & (Twin) Donalda. She was the daughter of Elizabeth (Brown) Maddux & George Maddux. Mica (Alexander) Anderson lived with Elizabeth (Anderson) Smartt and her parents Jim and Margaret Anderson, out the Everett Prichard ridge. The house burned. Elizabeth's brother, Howard Anderson built a smaller one and lived there awhile, probably when his daughter, Mahilda, went to Baxter Seminary.

Jim's first wife died and he took the children to Texas to visit his uncle, Joe Alexander and family. His mother, Mica went also to look after the children. She had re-married after her husband Riley Anderson died, but Mica left him. His name was Whit Spivey.
