

NANCY ELIZABETH (NICHOLS) BOYD OBT.

Mrs. Elizabeth Boyd, widow of the late A.)lexander L.)afayette "Fate" Boyd, died Wednesday morning of heart failure, while on a visit to her daughter, Mrs. Dolph Sullins, near Trinity. Her death came as a great shock to her relatives and friends.

She was about 60 years old and was a daughter of the late David Nichols, a prominent pioneer citizen of the western part of this county. She had been a devoted member of the Methodist church from her girlhood.

She is survived by 3 daughters, and 2 sons, Mrs. Steven Hayden Young of this city, Mrs. Ofa Johnson of Gainesboro, Mrs. Dolph Sullins of the 12<sup>th</sup> district, Jasper Boyd of Portland, OR, and Benton Boyd of OK, also by the following brothers and sisters, Mrs. G. D. Byrne of Monterey, Mrs. T. C. Holladay of Cookeville, Mrs. J. C. Nichols of Lebanon, J. P. Nichols and L. B. Nichols of Buffalo Valley, and B. B. Nichols of Boma.

Three brothers, Fate Nichols, Rev. John H. Nichols, and Rev. Jasper Nichols, and 1 sister, Mrs. James A. Boyd preceded her to the grave.

She was a splendid Christian lady, loved by all who knew her. Her remains were to be interred Thursday afternoon at Cookeville Cemetery beside those of her husband whose death occurred several years ago.
