Funeral Services in Detroit Saturday For Daniel Bartlett; Burial at Martin’s Creek:

Funeral services were held Sunday at Grosse Point, MI, for Daniel Bartlett, 51, whose death occurred Thursday at Grosse Point, after an illness of five months. Burial was in the Bartlett Cemetery on Martin’s Creek, Monday. The Masons had charge of the funeral at the grave.

For more than twenty years, Mr. Bartlett was employed at the Briggs Manufacturing Company as Chief of Plant Protection.

Before going to Detroit to make his home, Mr. Bartlett lived on Martin’s Creek in Putnam County, where he served as a member of the Quarterly Court from the Tenth District. In January, 1921, he was elected as a member of the Putnam County Board of Education, resigning some three years later when he moved his residence to Michigan.

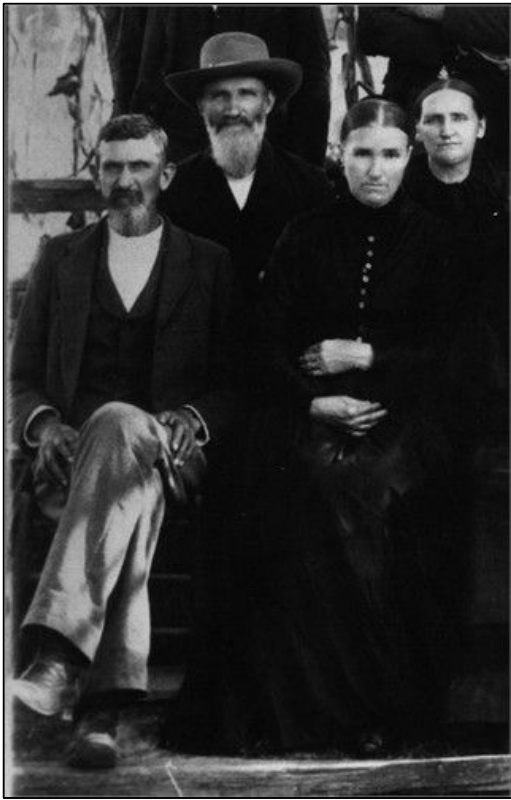
Mr. Bartlett was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Fate Bartlett.
