Buffalo Valley Man Died in Crash:

An elderly Buffalo Valley man was killed Friday morning after his truck was struck by another vehicle on Hwy. 70 West in a head-on crash, according to Trooper Robert Marlowe.

Houston C. Jared, 78, of Rt. 1 Buffalo Valley, was killed, and Harwood Huddleston, 77, and his wife, Beulah Huddleston, 71, both of Rt. 1 Buffalo Valley were treated at Cookeville General Hospital following the 2-car vehicle crash about 5 miles west of Baxter.

According to Trooper Marlowe's report, Jared was traveling west in a 1983 Ford pickup, while Huddleston was driving east in a 1978 Chevrolet pick-up. The wreck occurred when Huddleston's vehicle crossed the center line and hit Jared's truck head-on, Marlowe's report stated.

Mr. and Mrs. Huddleston were taken to Cookeville General Hospital for treatment, and Mr. Huddleston had been released by mid-afternoon, Friday.

Because of the severe damage done to Jared's vehicle, workers had to remove the truck's roof in order to free his body.

Services for Mr. Jared will be at 3:00 Sunday from the Pleasant Grove Methodist Church with burial in Jared Family Cemetery, in Buffalo Valley, Rev. Joe Ellidge and R. Ernest Cashdollar officiating. The family will receive visitors after 10:00 Saturday. The body was at the Baxter Chapel of Hooper-Huddleston Funeral Home in Baxter.

A farmer and a native of Putnam County, Mr. Jared was the son of the late Joseph Haywood and Ina McCaleb Jared.

Survivors include his wife, Ruby Maddux Jared; 2 sons, Joe Houston of Buffalo Valley, and David Morgan of N. Little Rock; 8 grandchildren, 3 great grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral Services Held Sunday for Joe H. Jared at His Home in Buffalo Valley:

Funeral services for Joe h. Jared, age 83, were conducted Sunday afternoon at two o'clock at his home near Buffalo Valley, with Rev. J. L. Smotherman, a Methodist minister of Carthage, officiating when several

hundred relatives and friends gathered to pay their final respects to one of Putnam County's heading citizens. During the funeral services, Major Rutledge Smith of Smithsville and Col. J. N. Cox of Cookeville paid tributes to Mr. Jared, with whom they had been closely associated for many years.

Mr. Jared's death occurred Saturday morning, October 14, at his home, following an illness of several weeks. A son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Josiah Jared, pioneer citizens of this section of Tennessee, he was born and reared in the Buffalo Valley community of Putnam County serving throughout his lifetime as one of its most prominent and influential farmer's and businessmen. Besides business interests, he was civic-minded and advocated at all times progressiveness-promoting good educational systems, enterprises which were for the betterment of his community, county and state and believed that a religious influence was necessary in all phases of life. He, with other businessmen, promoted Dixie College, later becoming the Tennessee Polytechnic Institute and represented Putnam County in the State Legislature during the session of 1933.

In 1887 he was married to Miss Laura Shields. Following her death, he married Miss Ina McCaleb, who survives him. In addition to his wife he is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Hallie Travis, Mrs. Morrison Lowe of Cookeville, Mrs. T. E. Miles of Nashville, and three sons, Morgan Jared, Houston Jared, of Buffalo Valley and Joyce Jared of Akron, OH. Three sons, Horace, Ralph and Bennett Jared preceded him in death some years ago. Surviving also are Mrs. F. P. McGinness, of Carthage, and sixteen grandchildren, two of whom are now on military duty.

Death of Ralph Jared Shock to Friends:

Ralph Jared, one of Putnam county's best known and beloved young men, died Thursday night, July 24th at 10 o'clock in the Veteran's Hospital, Memphis, where he had been ill for several weeks. His condition had been serious for several months, but his death came as a shock to his family, neighbors, relatives and many friends of the entire state, and his loss will be felt, especially in his own county.

Mr. Jared was 37 years of age; was educated at Dixie College, Cookeville, and Branham and Hughes Spring Hill, and was a popular boy with both friends and teachers. In the World War he was a member of the 31st Division, a Sergeant in Company K, 322 Infantry Regiment, and served over seas for more than a year.

The funeral services were conducted by Elder O. H. Tailman of the Church of Christ. Cookeville, on the lawn at the home of his father, Joseph H. Jared in Buffalo Valley, with a large attendance of sorrowing relatives and friends, and the burial was in the family graveyard. Travis, Detroit, MI, Mrs. Morrison Lowe, Cookeville and three brothers, Morgan, Houston and Joyce Jared of Buffalo Valley. His mother died many years ago, and his brothers, Bennett and Horace in recent years.

Mr. and Mrs. Jared had recently adopted a baby girl, having no children. One other girl whom they had reared and trained is now at Freed Hardeman School, Henderson, TN.

Ralph Jared was especially beloved by men of his farm and of the Buffalo Valley community with whom he worked, and will be missed by them. The sympathy of the many friends of Putnam county, over the state and elsewhere, are with the bereaved family in their great loss, and it is in the sympathy of loving friends that 'grief is crowned with consolation.'

Death Of Former Sheriff R. L. Jared:

Robert Lee Jared, County Road Supervisor and former Sheriff of Putnam county, died Thursday afternoon, at the Cookeville Hospital. On the previous Friday he suffered a cerebral hemorrhage, from which he never recovered consciousness. Following the stroke he was paralyzed in one side. He had previously had high blood pressure for some time but had appeared to be in good health and had devoted himself to the discharge of his official duties as county road supervisor, until he was stricken.

Had he lived until the 19th day of this month, he would have been 69 years old, but he had the spirit of a young man and his friends could hardly realize that he was as old as he really was.

He was a son of Josiah Jared, one of the leading pioneer citizens of this county. His grandfather, Joseph Jared, a Revolutionary soldier, emigrated from Virginia in his young manhood, and located at the "Low Gap," on the Old Walton Road, in the Western part of this county, where he reared a large family and died at the age of 88 in 1848, thus Robert L. Jared was the grandson of a Revolutionary soldier.

He was born and reared in Rock Spring Valley in the 11th Civil District of this county.

In his young manhood, he engaged in the mercantile business, on the Walton Road, at the point which, in after years, became known as "Gentry," on account of a post office by that name being established at that point with R. B. Gentry, then a merchant there, as postmaster.

He served as deputy sheriff under Sheriff G. W. Alcorn from 1896 until 1900, in which year he was elected Sheriff of Putnam county. He made a splendid sheriff.

He retired from the sheriff's office in 1902, and thereafter served most of the time either as guard at the State Prison, transportation officer, or guard at the Bushy Mountain State Mines, until he was elected county road supervisor.

In 1900, he was married to Miss Fannie Byrne, a daughter of Capt. James P. Byrne, of Nashville, who was reared in the Western portion of this county.

His wife died several years ago. He is survived by three grown children, Joe Jared, of New York; Carlisle Jared of Birmingham, AL, and Mrs. Hershall Harper, of Nashville, also by one brother, Joe H. Jared, of this county and one sister, Mrs. F. P. McGinness, of Carthage.

Three brothers, James, Ethelbert H., and Ed F. Jared, and three sisters, Mrs. James N. Maddux, Mrs. H. B. Maddux and Mrs. W. W. Jared, preceded him in death.

He is also survived by a large number of nephews, nieces and other relatives.

Funeral services were conducted Friday afternoon on the lawn of the old Josiah Jared home place in Rock Spring Valley, by Rev. Dow A. Ensor, a kinsman of the deceased, who paid a feeling tribute to his many splendid traits of character.

A large assemblage of relatives and friends bespoke the high esteem in which he was held.

Following the funeral service, burial took place in the J. H. Jared family cemetery.

"Bob" Jared, as he was familiarly known to all the people of this county, was a warm hearted, kind, and obliging gentleman, who counted his friends almost by his acquaintances.

As a peace officer he was fearless, efficient and cool-headed.

He belonged to one of the oldest pioneer families of this county, and one of the largest families in the county, a family which has been actively identified with the history of this county ever since the county was established. In addition to his large family connection he had many friends and many hearts are saddened by his passing.
