Funeral Services Held Wednesday, September 30 For Stanley Mitchell, Car Victim:

Funeral services were held Wednesday for Stanley Mitchell, 8, at the Church of Christ in Silver Point. Services were in charge of the Rev. J. A. Harris of Baxter. Stanley was killed instantly in Silver Point, when struck by a car while playing ball in the street on the way home from school Monday afternoon, September 28. The car was driven by a Mr. Lafever and it is reported that the accident was unavoidable.

Long Illness Fatal To Mack Mitchell, 83:

Funeral services for C. Mack Mitchell, 83, life long resident of Putnam County, who died Saturday at his home near Silver Point Presbyterian Church Sunday afternoon.

The Rev. Edgar M. Nunally, of Baxter, officiated at the services, and burial was in Silver Point Cemetery.

Son of Crockett and Tilda Mitchell, Mr. Mitchell was born near the place of his death. He was a member of the Presbyterian Church.

Mrs. C. M. Mitchell Dies At Her Home:

The death of Mrs. C. M. Mitchell, which occurred at her home here Wednesday morning at 11:25 a.m., came as a shock to this community. She went to the St. Thomas hospital in Nashville several days ago and learned she had cancer of the stomach and returned home last Saturday, her death was unexpected.

Mrs. Mitchell was 52 years of age and had been a faithful member of the Methodist church for the past 20 years.

Funeral services were held in the school house Friday afternoon, June 27 at 2 o'clock by Henry Puckett. The large crowd that attended her funeral and the many beautiful floral offerings showed the love and esteem in which she was held. Interment took place in the Silver Point cemetery. Her remains were laid beside her son, Charles, who died four years ago.

She leaves a husband, one daughter, Mrs. J. D. Spitzer of Harrisonburg, VA, five sisters, Mrs. J. E. McCormick of Chattanooga, Mrs. Lon Jones of Wilder, Mrs. E. L. John Tucker Obt.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday for John Tucker, 87, oldest attorney of the Putnam County Bar Association, who died Monday morning at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Buna Brown, in Double Springs after a long illness.

Services were conducted at the Double Springs Presbyterian Church by the Rev. Dow Ensor. Burial was in the Silver Point Cemetery.

Native of this county, Mr. Tucker was born and reared in the Silver Point community, where he lived until moving to Double Springs about 50 years ago.

His father, Louis Tucker, a Confederate soldier, was killed in battle when his son was only a few years old.

Shortly after reaching manhood, Mr. Tucker was elected Justice of the Peace for the Thirteenth District and, while still in his twenties, was elected chairman of the county court. He was admitted to the bar more than 60 years ago. He continued to practice law until his retirement a few years ago.

After moving to Double Springs he was again elected Justice of the Peace of the Seventh District, an office held until five years ago.

Besides his daughter, survivors include two sons, Albert Lewis and Ernest Boyd Tucker, both of Double Springs; four other daughters, Miss Mary Ann Tucker, Double Springs, Mrs. Carmie Carr, Mrs. Johnnie Randolph, and Mrs. Jessie Booker, all of Detroit, MI; a half-brother, W. C. Stewart, of Boma, TN.
