DIRECTIONS: From the Court House, head East on Spring Street. Spring Street eventually turns into Hwy 70N. Continue East on Hwy 70N. Turn left on Watson Rd. Pass Overstreet Rd on right. The cemetery is located next to the house that is just past Overstreet Rd on the right. Go up the long black top driveway. The cemetery is on the left.

J S Watson, 76, was found dead in his bed Thursday forenoon. When discovered the body was cold and indications pointed to heart failure as the cause of death. The deceased had been a resident of Crossville for some 20 years and had been a practicing lawyer before the bar here and in adjoining counties. Previous to moving to Crossville he had resided in Pleasant Hill and served a term in the county court as justice from that district. His wife passed away several years ago. The funeral services were held in the Christian church Friday at 3:30 p.m., the sermon being delivered by Judge C F Snodgrass of Knoxville. The remains were taken in the Bilbrey hearse to Putnam county and laid to rest in the Watson cemetery Saturday. Rev J V Wright conducted the services at the grave. Judge J R Mitchell dismissed court at Cookeville to permit the attorneys to attend the funeral. Some members of the Crossville bar accompanied the remains to the cemetery.

He married Harriet Quarles of Putnam County, and to this union 7 children were born, 6 sons and 1 daughter, all of whom survive except 1 son, J L. The children are: J B, Fleming, Ky; J T, Cromona, Ky; T T, Murfreesboro; Mrs. H E Noles, Lebanon; Snow, Old Hickory; all of whom were present at the funeral. The youngest son, E E, resides in Akron, Ohio and was unable to attend the funeral.

WATSON, JOHN B.: Esq. John B. Watson of the Third district died at his home last Thursday of typhoid fever. He was buried at the family graveyard near Brown's Mill on Friday.
