For and in consideration of the sum of \$5.00 – Five dollars, cash in hand paid to us, (The Trustees of Maddux Chappel – Methodist Episcopal Church, to wit: Matt Sadler, P.T. Hoggard, R.F. Shanks, Mrs. Ermie Plunkett and L.A. Shanks, - We, Virgil T. Denny and wife Audra Denny have bargained and sold, and by these presents do transfer and convey unto the said Matt Sadler, P.T. Haggard, R.F. Shanks, Mrs. Ermie Plunkett and L.A. Shanks or their successors subject to the doctrines, laws and usages and ministerial by the lawful authorities of the church, their heirs and assigns, a certain tract or parcel of land in Putnam County, State of Tennessee, as follows: Located in the 11th Civil District of Putnam County, Tennessee near the Indian Creek Road and bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a stake the north corner of the lands herewith conveyed and being the corner between Virgil T. Denny and the Methodist Episcopal Church land – known as Maddux Chappel, running thence south and parallel with Virgil T. Denny's line, One Hundred and Fifty feet to a stake, thence west and parallel with Virgil T. Denny's line, One Hundred and Fifty feet to a stake, thence north and parallel with Virgil T. Denny's line, One Hundred and Fifty feet to a stake, thence east and parallel with with Virgil T. Denny's line One Hundred and Fifty feet to the beginning corner, containing by estimation one fourth^{3/4} of an acre be the same more or less.


It is hereby agreed by the parties transferring this property and also the parties accepting the same that in the event the property herewith conveyed should cease to used for church purposes, the lands revert back to the said Denny and the buildings remain the property of the Maddux Chappel of the M.E. Church and it is further agreed and understood that a building is to be started within twelve month (12) from the date of this instrument or the same shall be considered as void and the lands are to revert to the said Denny.


To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, estate, title, and interest thereto belonging, to the said trustees of Maddux Chappel of M.E. Church their heirs and assigns, forever. And we do covenant with the said Trustees of Maddux Chapel of M.E. Church that we are lawfully


seized and possessed of said land in fee simple; have a good right to convey it, and the same is unencumbered.

And we do further covenant and bind ourselves our heirs and representatives, to warrant and forever defend the title to said land to the said Trustees of Maddux Capple of M.E. Church their heirs and assigns, against the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever. A lien is expressly retained upon the property herein conveyed to secure all the deferred payments of purchase money.

My Dad (**Luke Alexander Shanks**) was Secretary-Treasurer of the **original Maddux Church** which was up the holler from us, I have the roll of the members. My theory is this: For some reason, the church ceased to be (in the holler) and a tract was given for the **Maddux Chapel by Virgil Denny later known as Denny's Seminary Methodist Church**, named for the Denny's who gave the land, similar to the situation of Maddux Chapel.
