


James Nelson Maddux to Deed


Know all men by these presents that I James N. Maddux and Dora my wife of the County of Putnam and State of Tennessee for and in consideration of six hundred dollars in hand paid have bargained and sold and do hearby convey and deliver to James W. Sutton of the above named County and State all right title interest and claim in and to a certain tract of land lying and being on the waters of Indian Creek Civil District No. 11 County of Putnam and State of Tennessee bounded as follows, beginning on a hornbeam on the North bank of Indian Creek R.F. Maxwell's (*Robert Filmore Maxwell*) North west corner thence south with said Maxwell's west boundary line 117<sup>2/3</sup> poles to a stone the said Maxwell's south west corner thence north 72<sup>1/4</sup> degrees west 56 poles to a stake in center of Indian Creek thence up said creek with its various meanders to the beginning containing by estimation twenty five acres by the same more or less and I the said James N. Maddux do hereby bind my self my heirs and legal representatives to warrant and forever defend the title to said tract of land from the lawful claims of all persons whomsoever in testimony whereof I James N. Maddux together with Dora my wife have hereunto set our hands and seals. This the 31<sup>st</sup> day of May 1885.

Maddux having personally appeared before me privately and apart from her husband the said Eudora Maddux acknowledge the execution of the said deed or instrument to have been done by her freely, voluntarily and understandingly without compulsion or constraint from her said husband, and for the purposes therein expressed. *Hon. Josiah Jared, one of the most prominent and popular citizens of Putnam County died last Wednesday night (15 September 1898) at his home in Rock Springs Valley. He grew to manhood in this county. After completing his education he was a successful teacher, but for many years he devoted his attention to management of his large farm. all his life he was a great student and reader. In 1831 he joined the Methodist Church and for sixty-eight years he lived a Christian life full of good deeds and noble virtues. In 1851 he married Frances Bennett, whom he survived for several years. Burial took place near his home at Low Gap Cemetery, TN.*

I, **J.W. Puckett**, am the son of **Henry Puckett** and his second wife, **Annie Null**. I was born in DeKalb County, Tennessee, May 31, 1857. My father was the son of **John Puckett** and his wife, **Rhoda Lida Puckett**. He had four brothers and sisters: **Polly Puckett** md **Sam Murdock**; **George Puckett** md **Nancy Isbell**; **Prettyman Puckett** md **Martha Ann Jones**; **John & Daniel Puckett** moved out west; **Matilda Puckett** md **Thomas Jefferson Smith**; **Marinda Puckett** md **George Parsley**.

My brother, Henry Puckett, lives on my father's old farm which is the farm of my grandfather, John Puckett, and where he cleared up the land and established himself in Tennessee. Our grandfather, John Puckett, and his wife, Rhoda, are buried 100 yards from the present home of my brother, Henry Puckett.

Hon. Cordell Hull:

Reference is made to your letter of February 28, in which you request the military record of John Puckett. You are advised that it appears from the papers in the Revolutionary War Pension Claim, R-8511, John Puckett was born February 26, 1764, in Botetourt County, Virginia.

While residing in Washington (that part was later Russell) County in the western part of Virginia he served at various times with the Virginia troops in forts on the frontier doing duty and in scouting parties of Captains Charles Hayes and Thomas Price. The service in all amounted to six months but no dates of service given.

After the Revolution he lived in Knox County, Kentucky, and in White County, Tennessee.

He was allowed pension on application executed January 16, 1834, at which time he was living in White County, Tennessee, having lived there about twenty years.

The soldier married December 25, 1809, in White County, Tennessee, Rhoda Lida or Lidy. In 1856 she was living in DeKalb County, Tennessee and was aged seventy-one years. At this time she stated her husband, John Puckett, died September 4, 1844. From other records in the Bureau, it appears his pension was paid September 4, 1845. There are no dates as to children.
