J. W. McDaniel have bargained and sold this day and do hereby transfer and convey unto Timothy Denny and his heirs forever for the consideration of Three Thousand dollars to me paid a track of land in the state of Tennessee, Putnam Co., District No. 11 containing by estimation two hundred acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows: Beginning on a sugartree on the south bank of Indian Creek (the north fork of said creek) running east one hundred and three poles to a lynn thence north twenty poles to a Buckeye thence east one hundred poles to a creek at the corner of a field formally owned by Allen Young thence south thirty four poles to a lynn stump and the sugar tree thence east one hundred and thirty eight poles to a stake, thence north 27 degrees west two hundred poles on about that distance to the north spring of Indian Creek thence west with the meanders of said creek to the beginning. To have and to hold the same to the said Timothy Denny his heirs and assigns forever. I do covenant with the said Timothy Denny that I am lawfully seized of said land and have a good right to convey this land and that the same is unencumbered. I do further covenant and bind myself, my heirs and representatives to warrant and forever defend the title to said land and every part then of to the said Timothy Denny his heirs and assigns against the lawful claims of all person this the 13 day of August 1870.
