At some point in 1864, Timothy Denny was forced to take the oath of allegiance to the Union by an army patrol. During the 1863 and 1864 Civil War, and unknown Union officer stationed at Carthage kept a record of at least some of the Confederates that were forced to swear the oath of allegiance and post a bond that they would not aid the confederacy. The record was kept on some blank pages of a store ledger that had been confiscated and the individual dates of each event were not recorded, although the first pledge was listed as October 6, 1863. The men included were residents of Smith, Jackson, Putnam, and DeKalb counties.

John L. Huddleston of Putnam County [son-in-law of Zachariah and Catherine Stallings Denney. Huddleston is thought to have died during the war during Confederate Service so he may have broken his oath]. Bond for \$5000. His securities were Jesse Pickard and Jonathan Denney of Putnam County [Denney- was Huddleston's brother-in-law and son of Zachariah Denney].

William Haynes of Putnam County. Bond for \$5000. Securities were Jesse Pickard and Jonathan Denney of Putnam County.

Daniel Brown of Putnam County. Bond for \$5000. Securities were Jesse Pickard and Jonathan Denney of Putnam County.

Jesse Pickard of Smith County. Bond of \$5000. Securities were Jonathan Denney and Daniel Brown of Putnam County.

Jonathan Denney [son of Zachariah Denney] of Smith County. Bond for \$5000. Securities were Jesse Pickard and Daniel Brown of Putnam County.

Timothy Denney [son of Zachariah Denney] of Putnam County. Bond not specified. Securities were Jonathan Denney and Jesse Pickard of Smith County.

It is interesting to note that several of these men were listed as both of Smith and Putnam County. They lived in Buffalo Valley very near the line between the two counties. This area was particularly dangerous and was the local of severe guerilla warfare. Also listed in the oaths was Wiley Brown Denney. You may remember that Wiley Brown Denney was the great grandfather of Vice President Al Gore. He became a very popular Primitive Baptist Minister and bragged often and loudly in his latter years that he never took the Oath to the Union. Well, this list would seem to prove otherwise.

Brown Denney of Smith County. \$1000 Bond. Securities Wiley Denney and Franklin Denney of Smith County [these men were Brown Denney's father and brother] I suppose that Brown may have reenlisted in the service of some Confederate unit after this oath was taken but he apparently did swear an oath at some time.

84th Tennessee Infantry Regiment

Organized December, 1862; consolidated with 28th Tennessee Infantry, March 8, 1863 to form 28th Consolidated Tennessee Infantry Regiment. The 84th Regiment was raised by Colonel Sidney S. Stanton in the country around McMinnville in November and December, 1862, with seven companies.

Field Officers: Colonel Sidney S. Stanton; Lieutenant Colonel R.C. Sanders; & Major W. Gooch Smith.

Captains: W.H. McDonald, Co. "A". Enrolled November 8 at Chestnut Mound and McMinnville, Smith and Warren Counties. Consolidated with "G" to form "E", 28th Consolidated.

Hugh H. Lannden, Co. "B". Enrolled November 15, at McMinnville, Warren County. Became Co. "F", 28th Consolidated.

W. L. Woods, Co. "C". Enrolled November 19, 1862 at McMinnville, Warren County. Became Co. "G", 28th Consolidated.

Roysden Robinson, Co. "D". Enrolled November 27 at McMinnville, Warren County; some men from Putnam County. Became Co. "H", 28th Consolidated.

S.B. Whaley, Co. "E". Enrolled November 25 at Smithville, DeKalb County. Became "I", 28th Consolidated.

J.G. Maxwell, Co. "F". Enrolled December 1 from Overton County, consolidated with "B" of 28th Regiment to form "K", 28th Consolidated.

W.A. Ensor, Co. "G". Enrolled December 22 from Putnam County. Consolidated with "A" to form "E" of 28th Consolidated.

Colonel Stanton was originally colonel of the 25th Tennessee Infantry Regiment. Both he and Lieutenant Colonel R. C. Sanders, of the same regiment, resigned shortly after the Battle of Shiloh because of some difficulty with Brigadier General John S. Marmaduke over some question of discipline. Sanders became lieutenant colonel of the 84th and Captain W. Gooch Smith, also from the 25th, became major. According to Colonel Stanton, the regiment remained in the vicinity of McMinnville until just before the Battle of Murfreesboro, joining the Army of Tennessee December 29, 1862 and being assigned to Brigadier General D. S. Donelson's Brigade, Major General B. F. Cheatham's Division, Lieutenant General Leonidas Polk's Corps. Donelson's Brigade, at this time, was composed of the 8th, 16th, 51st and 48th Regiments, plus Carnes' Battery.

General Donelson, in his report of the battle, stated: "The 84th, being a new and very small regiment, was assigned to my command December 29, 1862, only two days before the battle. I deemed it best to leave it in the rear in support of Carnes' Battery. Colonel Stanton's Regiment was not seriously engaged, though I do not doubt, if an opportunity had presented itself, that both he and his men would have fought most gallantly."

Colonel Stanton reported that the 84th never drew arms until Monday evening, December 29th and, the regiment never having been drilled in the manual of arms (loading, etc.), "I drilled the regiment all day Tuesday, on the field, under the enemy's shells, and likewise Wednesday morning until the battle opened." He went on to state that Carnes' Battery having been moved off to the right, his regiment stayed in support of the Washington Battery, which was situated to his left; and later, with Colonel Savage's 16th Tennessee Regiment, moved up to "the brick house." "Forty of my men came up from McMinnville, got arms and accoutrements, and

came to us in the hottest part of the fight, while we were under heavy shelling in the open field." He reported two men wounded.

The organization of the regiment was pronounced illegal by the War Department, and on March 8, 1863, it was consolidated with the 28th Tennessee Regiment to form the 28th Consolidated Tennessee Regiment. Colonel Stanton became colonel of the consolidated regiment. See the history of the 28th Tennessee Infantry Regiment for further history of the organization.

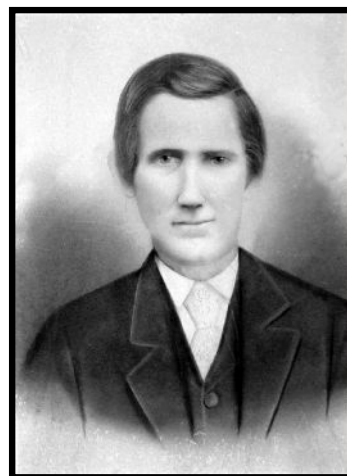

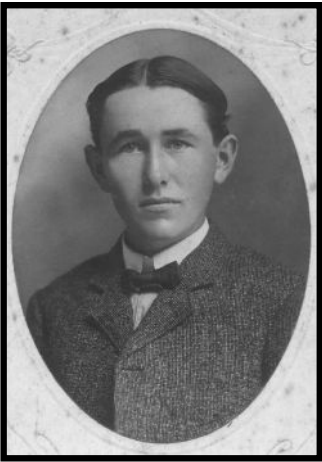

The pale horse and his rider, with relentless power is persistent with frequent visits to our community taking our very best, and leaving only grief and empty hearts. But death can only conquer the flesh, the soul belongeth to our father, who gave it.

Just a few weeks ago, death claimed as a victim, Mrs. Hettie Paul Denny, the sainted mother of Minnie M. and Virgil T. Denny, their father having preceded their mother to rest some twenty-three years. This mother reared her children in a Christian home, faithfully serving her Lord and Master. She was a member of the Methodist Church, and a living example to the entire community.

These are not idle words of tribute but come from one who loved her as a friend and neighbor. The entire neighborhood loved and honored "Aunt Hettie" as she was affectionately called by most everyone, and we have yet to hear it said that she had even an enemy in all the world. She was indeed a blessing to this community.

John T. Askew, eighty-five years old, widely known and highly respected, gave us this interview: "I was born on Wilkin's Creek, DeKalb county, July 9, 1840, and located at Buffalo Valley, Putnam county, January 1, 1867, where I have since resided. The old log school and church house, about a mile up the Valley, was our only public meeting place. Capt. Exum, who was the first merchant here, boarded at my house. Samuel Young was considered the richest man in the county. When I came to the Valley, the well known citizens in this section were, as well as I remember: Snowden Maddux, Joshua Bartlett, Matthew Scudder, Thomas Maddux, Samuel Young, David Nichols, John Evans, Peter Young, **Jonathan Denny**, **Timothy Denny**, Robert Alcorn, James Isbell, Jenkins Jones, Loona Thompson, George Maddux, John Jared, Bradley Maddux. Perhaps I have forgotten some. Soon after the war Green Duke, the founder of a religious sect called the 'Dukeites,' gained a considerable following here. He claimed that he could handle snakes and drink poisons and that he would never die. After his death the sect died out. The first time I was in Cookeville I was about sixteen years old and went there with my father to a horse race. We had been to a big race at Smithville, and went on to Cookeville, passing through Mine Lick. In those days there were numerous race tracks in this and adjoining countries, plenty of whiskey and lots of gambling. These were good places for gamblers to meet and try their luck." Person was formed in 1791 from Caswell. The act was to become effective February 1, 1792. It was named in honor of General Thomas Person, a Revolutionary Patriot, a member of the Council of Safety and a trustee of the University of North Carolina. He gave a large sum of money to the University, and a building was elected in his honor, which is called Person Hall. It is in the north central section of the State and is bounded by Granville, Durham, Orange and Caswell countries, and the State of Virginia.
