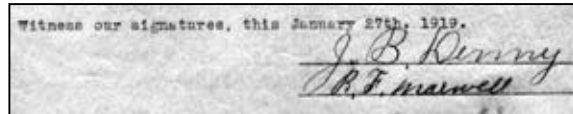

Funeral services were held today at Denny's Seminary for John Bell Denny, 81, who died at his home Tuesday morning of a heart attack. Rev. J. A. Harris was in charge. Burial was in the Smellage Cemetery, Boma, TN. He was a member of the Methodist Church at Denny's Seminary. He was the last member of the family of the late Jonathan Denny, and was a brother of the late Judge T.L. Denny and Silas Denny of Cookeville. Survivors are his wife, Mrs. Eliza Barnes Denny, and several nieces and nephews.

Funeral services were held Wednesday morning for Mrs. John Bell Denny, (Eliza Jane Barnes Denny) 82, at Denny's Seminary. Interment was in Smellage Cemetery. Mrs. Denny died at her home in the Buffalo Valley community Sunday evening after a long illness. She was a loyal member of the Methodist Church. She was noted for her hospitality, kindness, and humility. She had no children of her own but reared Ethel (Man) L. Jared and Charles Johnson a nephew of her husband. Services were held this week for Grover Anderson, 81, a prominent resident who helped save Tennessee Tech in one of its darkest days. A native, Anderson was a merchant in Baxter who served terms on the Putnam School Board and who for 40 years was a trustee at Baxter Seminary. He was serving as Putnam's state representative in 1929 when years of resentment against higher education and the stock market crash that led to the Depression threatened to dry up state dollars for the state college in Cookeville. That year, Anderson campaigned for \$1 million in state funding for Tennessee Tech for its annual budget. He got \$250,000. He attributed much of the shortcoming to competition from other state colleges in Tennessee that are scrambling for state support.

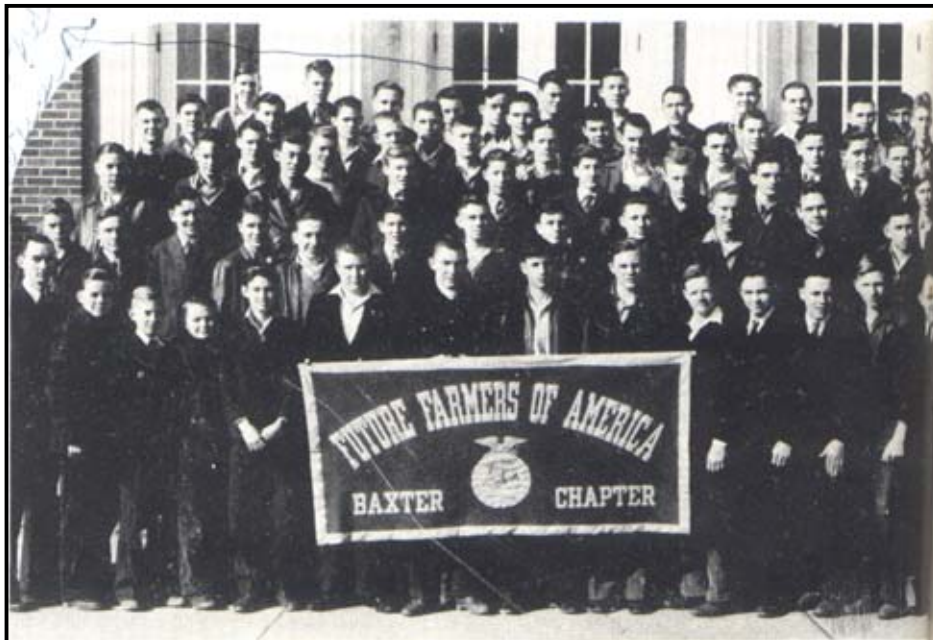
