STATE OF TENNESSEE, Putnam COUNTY.
To Mrs. Hettie Denny a Citizen of Putnam County:

Whereas, it appears to the Court here that Timothy Denny late of said County, is dead, and hath made his last Will and Testament in writing, in which he hath appointed Hettie Denny Executrix to the same, which Will hath been exhibited in Court, that Letters Testamentary of all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits of the said Timothy Denny deceased, issued to the said Hettie Denny having been qualified according to law.

These are therefore to empower you, the said Hettie Denny to enter into and upon all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits of the said Timothy Denny deceased, and the same in your possession take wheresoever the same may be found, and a true and perfect inventory thereof to made, and return to our ensuring County Court, and all just debts of the said Timothy Denny deceased, to pay; and also well and truly pay and deliver all the legacies contained and specified in said Testament, as far as the said goods, chattels, and credits will thereunto extend, and the law charge you.
