REMEMBER A SOLDIER WHO DIED IN '45 FOR US

To the Editor:

I read the article in the November 11 Tennessean, headlined "Meet pair of old warhorses who embody veteran spirit." It told about Gen. Hugh B. Mott and PFC John Mullane during World War II.

Mott was a hero of the Bridge at Remagen. Mullane was a soldier in the South Pacific.

The article made me feel good to know that someone remembers and cares about what happened during that time.

I have read every article, story and book I could find about the Bridge at Remagen. No doubt, Mott - then a lieutenant in the Army - was a hero.

Not all of the heroes at Remagan merely risked their lives - many gave their lives, including **1st Lt. Frank D. Winchester, my first cousin.**

Never a March 9 passes that I don't think about him. He was killed at the Remagen Bridge.

Frank was a happy civilian when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor. He had made it through the Great Depression, finished high school, worked his way through college and gotten his master's degree.

He was very athletic, playing football and boxing in high school and college. He was happily married to his longtime girl friend, **Edith Amonette** and was employed by the Department of Agriculture in Pike County, KY. He had just purchased a new Ford.

In today's language, we would say that Frank had it made. But World War II was to change his life and also end it. He never got to enjoy the freedoms that Gen. Mott and PFC Mullane enjoy, nor the freedom that I have enjoyed for the past 53 years since that fateful day.

He married on the 14th of June 1939, Putnam Co., TN to Edith Maddux (Amonette) Winchester (1918-1995). She later married Jim Carney. Frank is buried in plot E, row 9, grave 18, in the Henri-Chapelle American Cemetery, Henri-Chapelle, Belgium. He has a marker in the Rock Springs Cemetery next to his wife Edith Amonette Winchester Carney.
