BAXTER – Funeral services for Charles Martin Nunally Sr., 79, of Baxter will be held at 2 p.m. on Wednesday, August 5, from the Baxter chapel of Hooper & Huddleston Funeral Home. Burial will be in Odd Fellows Cemetery.

The family will receive friends from 4-9 p.m. today at the funeral home.

Mr. Nunally died on Monday, August 3, 1998, at Cookeville Regional Medical Center.

He was born on April 18, 1919, in Baxter to the late Van Daily Nunally Sr. and Aline Leftwich Nunally.

Mr. Nunally was a pharmacist, as was his father before him. His father was the founder of the Nunally Drug Store in Baxter, which opened in 1912. Mr. Nunally followed in his fathers' footsteps and worked there until 1985 when he retired. He was mayor of Baxter from 1968-1972 and a teacher for one year at Ensor Bottom Elementary School in Baxter.

The first president of the Baxter Civitan Club, he was a lieutenant in the Army Air Corps during World War II. Mr. Nunally was chairman of the board of First United Methodist Church in Baxter.

His family includes his wife, Louise Durham Nunally; a son, Chuck Nunally of Cookeville; three daughters, Laura Sue Bilbrey of Pikeville, Jane Ellen Benzing of Jacksonville, Fla., and Mattie Jo Clinton of Baxter; a brother, Rupert Nunally of Columbus, Ga.; a sister, Sadie Sue Tidwell of Nashville; three stepsons, Jim Elmore of Ocean Side, Calif., David Elmore of Virginia Beach, Va., and Gary Elmore of Altus, Okla.; a stepdaughter, Linda Fernandez of Baxter; 17 grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

In addition to his parents, he was also preceded in death by his first wife, Cleo Lundy Nunally; two brothers, Tom and General Van Daily Nunally Jr.; and a stepson, Danny Elmore.

Pallbearers will be Mr. Nunally's grandsons, Michael and Matt Bilbrey, Andy Brown, Charles Martin Nunally III, Robert Benzing, Todd Clinton, and Curtis Nunally.

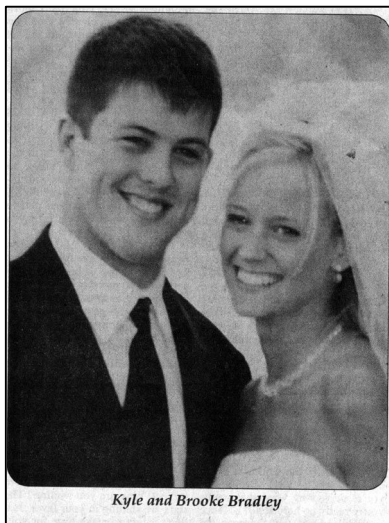
