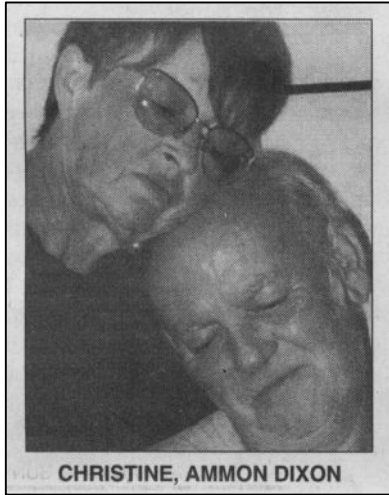


Ammon (Odie) and Christine F. Dixon Obts.



GAINESBORO -- Funeral services for Ammon (Odie) and Christine F. Dixon, both 67, will be held Monday, May 28, at 11 a.m. at Anderson-Upper Cumberland Funeral Home. Burial will be in Harpeth Hills Memory Gardens.

Both died Sunday, May 20, 2007, at their residence.

Mr. Dixon was born Feb. 7, 1940, in Jackson County to the late Johnie and Lorene Hawkins Dixon.
