Robert Garland Draper, 90, a former assistant U. S. Attorney and State Representative and at one time an active Democratic party leader died at Resthaven Nursing Home in Memphis May 22.

Mr. Draper served 11 years in the office of U. S. Attorney by his friend and political ally, the late U. S. Senator Estes Kefauver. He was Shelby County Manager for Cordell Hull in his race for the Senate.

Born in Gainesboro he was the son of the late W. W. "Bill" and Emily Settle Draper.

Mr. Draper was elected to the State House of Representatives when he was 20. Later he practiced law in Boise, ID, before coming to Memphis and practicing for more than 50 years. He was a 1908 law graduate of Cumberland University. Mr. Draper retired from active practice in 1966.

A history bluff, Mr. Draper was known as a speaker and writer on the history of Middle Tennessee. He was a communicate of the Cathedral of Immaculate Conception.

While in Idaho, he had been secretary of the Idaho State Community. He served as president of five civic clubs in Memphis.

Mr. Draper leaves two daughters, Mrs. Emily Lessard of Memphis and Miss Garland Draper of Asheville, NC, a son, Wallace Draper of Memphis, a brother, James Draper of Chattanooga, seven grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Services were held at 2 p.m. Tuesday, May 24, 1977 at Swift Treadwell and Canole Funeral Directors with burial in Calvary Cemetery.

A memorial service for Mr. Draper was held by Memphis and Shelby County Bar Association at 9:30 a.m. Thursday, May 26 in Chancery Court.

**Anne Glankler (Draper) MaCauley Obt.**

Mrs. Annie Draper McCauley, 53, wife of Robie Mayhew MaCauley, author and fiction editor of Playboy magazine, died Monday in Presbyterian St. Luke's Hospital.

Mrs. Macauley, of 1323 N. Sandburg, terrace, was the former publicity director of Rinehard Co., a publishing firm now named Holt, Rinehart and Winston Inc., New York City.

Other survivors include her son, Cameron; her father, R. Garland Draper; a sister, Garland Draper, and two brothers, Edward and Wallace Draper.

Services will be private.

**James Travis Draper Obt.**

James Travis Draper, 84, formerly of Lookout Mountain, died Saturday evening in a local hospital. He was born in Gainesboro, TN, the son of the late Judge William Wallace and Emily Settle Draper. Mr. Draper had been a resident of Chattanooga and Lookout Mountain since 1919, when he returned to civilian status following service in the U. S. Navy in World War I. Previous to that time he had resided in the west where much of his time was spent with the Beaver River Power CO, and in doing preparatory work for entrance to Cornell University.

After two months at Cornell, he left to enlist in the U. S. Navy. On his separation from the service he became connected with the Hamilton National Bank, where he remained until 1924, when he resigned to enter the life insurance field. In 1929, he and Mrs. Draper opened the Draper Insurance Agency, handling both life and general insurance. This agency became associated with Pryor, Love and Lewis, in September 1960, where Mr. Draper remained until his retirement. He is a former member of the Insurors of Chattanooga and of Fairyland Club. He holds membership in Post 14 of the American Legion 199 F & AM, VFW Post 4048, Telluride Association of Cornell University and

BPOE (Elks), Chattanooga Lodge. His church affiliation is with the Lookout Mountain Presbyterian Church, where he was a member of the Men's Bible Class.

Survivors are his wife, Mrs. Mattie Morrison Draper; four nieces and nephew of Memphis.

A graveside service was held in Forest Hills Cemetery with Dr. George Long officiating.
