Arthur H. Willoughby, Vice President of the Jackson County Bank in Gainesboro and manger of the Granville Branch, died in Jackson County Hospital Wednesday morning, January 3. He was 69 years of age and his death followed an extended illness.

Funeral services were conducted Thursday, January 4 at 1:00 p.m. from the Granville Church of Christ. Bro. Mack Wayne Craig of Nashville officiated. Interment was in Granville Cemetery with Draper and Naff Funeral Home and Sutton-Anderson Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.

Mrs. Willoughby died in Jackson County Hospital on Monday, February 1, following an extended illness. She was 72 years of age.

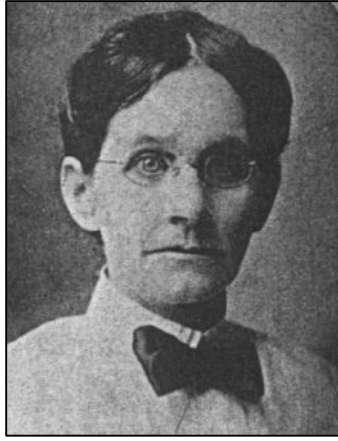
A native of Jackson County, she was the **daughter of the late Dr. and Mrs. W. B. Page and the widow of Arthur Willoughby**.

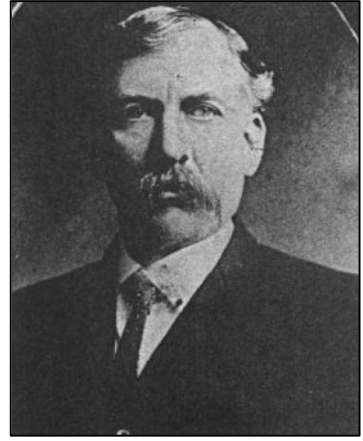
