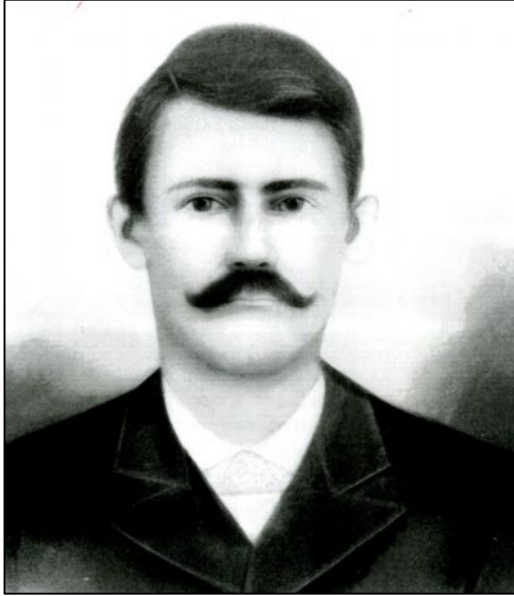

Family Letters:

23 April 1920, Buffalo Valley, TN:

Dear Aunt Nellie & Uncle Prettyman,

Thought I would write to as mother was writting (sic) you said Uncle Prettyman was enjoying them. I sure am glad I spent the night with May and Rubie Tuesday night. We had a fine time. Rubie started to milk and the cow wasn't there so Hooper went after her and turned her to the calf and the calf got the milk so we laughed at Rubie. She wouldn't go out there to milk she was afraid of the graveyard.

I think ha ha how are you getting along Aunt Nellie, fine I hope.

Haskells babby (sic) is just like Uncle Prettyman, tell him it is sure sweet. Hope you all will be home soon as I am anxious to see you both. May and Rubie and Willard and Luke are getting along fine without you all. May said she missed you all well. Aunt Nellie I will have to close. Love to you both answer soon.

Saturday morning, 24 April 1920:

Dear Prettyman & Nelia,

I received your card. Am awfully glad you are getting along so well.

Hope you will continue so. Stay as long as you think advisable.

The children are getting along just fine.

They are going right ahead with farm work.

I believe they are taking more interest since you are away. They feel more responsibility, you know sometimes I think such experience is good for children.

Mauda came home last Saturday. Their baby is awfully sweet. They have a baby colt over there also.

Haskel is just tickled to death over his baby.

We had an awful hail storm here last Sunday night. Something more than we every had before. Also nearly a flood with it. Several people are having to reroof their houses on account of it.

Mr. Bill Medley's car house and car washing away, tore car all to pieces. Nearly swept his farm away. Lost a log wagon also. Think they found a few pieces of it.

Not hurt to your place nor ours. It seems that it was mostly spent when it reached us. But enough we thought. We didn't care to see anymore. Everything is looking mighty pretty and green trees all leafing out. Fruit trees badly beaten by hail storm also hurt by frost yet there is some fruit left.

Yell as I have to prepare dinner. Will close. Do everything you can to get well. Hope to see you both greatly improved when you come home.

Write me again.
