Burial was to be in City Cemetery.

Mr. Shanks died early Wednesday morning in Cookeville General Hospital where he had been a patient for the past month. He had been ill for more than a year.

He had owned and operated the Shanks Hotel here since 1908 and had during that time built it into a Cookeville landmark.

He assumed ownership of what was then called the Duke Hotel from his mother who had operated it from 1890 to 1908.

During the more than half century of his career, Mr. Shanks constantly made additions and improvements which ranked his hotel as one of the best in the town the size of Cookeville.

He made major additions in 1928 and 1947 and only 2 years ago added a modern elevator.

Mr. Shanks served as a commissioner for Cookeville on 3 different occasions and was federal jury commissioner for the Northeast division of Middle Tennessee.

Active in the Democratic party on the local and state levels, Mr. Shanks usually preferred to work in the background rather than be a candidate for office.

He was appointed a colonel on the staffs of Gov. Buford Ellington and former Gov. Frank Clement.

When the Upper Cumberland Chamber of Commerce was formed in 1941 to work for the development of the Cumberland River, Mr. Shanks was elected treasurer and helped lead the drive which secured Wolf Creek, Dale Hollow, and Center Hill Dams.

He was a charter member of the Cookeville Lions club and served several years as a director of the Putnam County Chamber of Commerce. Mr. Shanks served for 30 years as a deacon of the First Baptist Church.

He was a long-time director of the Nashville American Auto Associate Club and had served as president of the Tennessee branch of AAA.

He was a son of S. R. and Molly Shores Shanks. Born in White County, he moved here at the age of 4.

He married the former Miss Elizabeth Maddux of Granville who survives.

Other survivors include 2 sons, George S. and Herbie K. Shanks; a grandson, George Howard Shanks, all of Cookeville, and a brother, Luke Shanks of Crossville.

Active pallbearers included Paul Shanks, Crossville, E. P. Watson, W. R. Whitaker, Jr., W. B. Carlen, Jr., Joe Gibson, McCoy Shelton, all of Cookeville, Henry Staley, Washington, D.C. and Raymond Davis, Nashville.
