GUS A. MADDUX CALLED BY DEATH: Nashville Banner, Nashville, TN: Friday Evening, 29 January 1926

Prominent Real Estate Man had Been in Business Here for 45 Years:

Gus A. Maddux, founder of G. A. Maddux & Co. real estate firm of this city died at his home, 314 South Street at 6:30 o'clock Thursday afternoon in his 79th year. Mr. Maddux had been in ill health for nearly a year following an operation last spring. He retired from active business and during the summer and fall appeared to be in improved health, but failed rapidly within the past few weeks.



Mr. Maddux came to Nashville forty-five years ago, and for five years was connected with the firm of Lannon & Co. on the public square. Such was his faculty for making friends that it was said of him that he probably knew more people by name and residence who passed through the square, whether citizens of Nashville or elsewhere in Middle Tennessee, than any other local man.

In 1835 Mr. Maddux entered the real estate business and became a member of the firm of Yarbrough, Maddux & Davis. This firm did a heavy business and for more than ten years Mr. Maddux was a valuable asset to them. After that he

became a member of the firm of Maddux & Connor and later of Callender & Maddux, the senior partner being the well-known Thomas Callender, one of the pioneer real estate men of Nashville. When he and Mr. Callender dissolved partnership, Mr. Maddux went into business for himself under the name of G. A. Maddux & Co. and such has been the title of his firm every since.

Eighteen years ago he took into the business with him as a partner his son, W. R. Maddux, and later another son. Mr. Maddux more and more turned the active conduct of the business over to them and of late years he interested himself as special loan agent for the Northwestern Life Insurance Company for Tennessee and Kentucky.

Mr. Maddux promoted and operated the old dummy line of railroad which for many years ran from the river front to West Nashville. And he was also instrumental in organizing the old west Nashville Building & Loan Association. Mr. Maddux also served as jailer when he first came to Nashville.

He is survived by his wife, Elizabeth Connell Maddux and by his sons, Connell R., William R., & Frank G. Maddux of this city, and by a brother, ___ of Louisville, a sister, Mrs. F. Childress of Nashville, and by eleven grandchildren.

Funeral services will be conducted at the Edgefield Baptist church at 2:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon by the Rev. W. M. Wood. PROMINENT YOUNG MAN PASSES AWAY: Gus W. Maddux Dies at Home on White's Creek Pike at Age of 35 Years.

A death that will come as a sad blow to a host of friends in Nashville is that of **Mr. Gus Wilkinson Maddux**, prominent young business man, who died at his home on the White's Creek pike this morning at 4 o'clock at the age of 35 years. Mr. Maddux leaves a **wife, who was Miss Lucille McCampbell, daughter of Dr. W. E. McCampbell**, and five children. He is also **survived by his father, Mr. G. A. Maddux**, and three brothers, Connel R. Maddux of Bowling Green, KY, and W. R. and Frank G. Maddux of this city. The remains were conveyed to the residence of his father, Mr. G. A. Maddux, 314 Fourth Street, South.

Mr. Maddux was born and reared in Nashville, and had become one of the best-known young business men in the city. He was educated in the city public schools and at Montgomery Bell Academy. Among his first business connections was one with Harris-Davis Dry Goods Co. He organized the Gus W. Maddux Raving Co., and later consolidated with the late Charles Butler, forming the Capitol City Construction Co., which at that time was one of the largest contracting companies in the city.

The body was taken to the home of his father, 314 Fourth Street. The funeral will be held Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the Church of the Hold Name, Sixth and Woodland street, services being conducted by Father O'Neil. Interment will be at Mt. Olivet Cemetery, and the following will serve as pallbearers: Perry Williams, Ed McCarthy, George T. Hutchinson, E. R. McCord, K. M. Throop and Allen Connell.

SISTER MADDUX SPENT 51 YEARS AS AN EDUCATOR: 6 February 1996, TN

Sister Florence Hildegard Maddux, 85, 801 Dominican Drive, Nashville, a Catholic nun and retired educator, died yesterday at St. Cecilia Convent of a heart attack.

A funeral Mass will be held at 3:45 p.m. tomorrow at St. Cecilia Convent with Bishop Edward U. Kmiec as chief celebrant.

Prayers and visitation will be at 6:45 p.m. today at St. Cecilia Convent Cemetery. Woodlawn Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.

A native of Nashville, Florence Maddux took the name of Sister Hildegard in 1930 when she received the white habit of the Dominican Order at St. Cecilia. She professed religious vows there in 1931.

She later taught at Nashville's Overbrook School, St. Mary's Orphanage, St. Cecilia Academy, Aquinas College and, from 1977-81, at St. Henry School.

Although she spent most of her career as a classroom teacher, she served as principal at St. Cecilia Academy from 1961-63 and again from 1967-68.

In addition to teaching in Nashville, Sister Maddux taught at schools in Chattanooga, Jackson, Oak Ridge and Chicago during her 51 years as an educator.

She also served as principal at St. Thomas School in Memphis, St. Peter and St. Paul Schools in Chattanooga, St. Mary School in Phoebus, VA, and St. Gertrude School in Cincinnati.

EX-VANDY SPORTS STAR ED MADDUX DIES AT 76

Ed Maddux, a Nashville businessman who was a two-sport athlete at Vanderbilt University and was the father and grandfather to succeeding Commodore players, died yesterday at 76.

Maddux, who helped found Nashville's Southern Machinery Co., lettered in basketball in 1943 and in football in 1946-47 at Vanderbilt.

His son, Hendersonville businessman Ray Maddux, lettered in basketball in 1971, 1972 and 1973, and grandson Drew was a Vanderbilt basketball standout in 1995, 1996, 1997 and 1998.

A native of east Nashville who resided in Madison, James Edward Maddux was president and board chairman of Southern Machinery.

He served in the U. S. Army and was a World War II veteran. Prior to college, he graduated from Montgomery Bell Academy.

He was a member of Inglewood United Methodist Church and the Downtown Rotary Club.

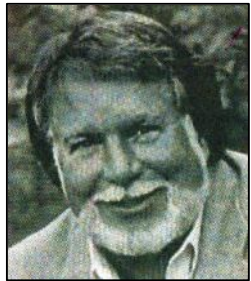

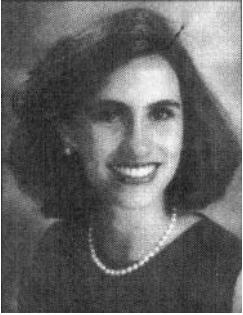

Drew Maddux will become the third generation of Madduxes to play basketball for Vanderbilt. He committed to become a Commodore in July.

:It seems like the biggest weight has been lifted off my shoulders,” he said. “And it’s only from the pressure that I put on myself – with all those hours of work – to put myself into a position where I can play on the next level.

“And it is especially gratifying that I will be attending Vanderbilt, I grew up around it. This is what I’ve wanted to do all my life.”

Sharing the moment, along with family members, was **Drew’s father, Ray Maddux**. His son will play for former teammate and new Vandy coach, Jan Van Breda Kolff.

Ed Maddux, Ray’s father and Drew’s grandfather, played football and basketball for Vandy in the 1940s.
