In the Name of God Amen I, Archibald Paul of South Carolina and Fairfield District, being weak in body but sound of mind and memory and understanding, calling to mind the mortality of my body, think it necessary to publish this my last will and testament. That is to say first I give my soul to God and bequeath my body to be in a decent manner at the discretion of my executors and the worldly property that God hath blessed me with, I give and bequeath the following manner. That is to say I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Robinson seven pounds. Also I give to Betty Russell seven pounds. Also I give and bequeath to Martha Robinson seven pounds. Also I give to my son William Paul seven pounds and to Moses Paul seven pounds. I also give to my son John Paul all this plantation with houses, horses, cows, hogs, furniture and every thing about the place with this condition that the said John Paul is to pay the sum annexed to every ones name. I also give to my daughter Margaret Russell seven pounds, also I give to my son James Paul's two children the land at the Catawba. I also give to the Covenanter Society in Winnsboro for the use of building a meeting house ten dollars. And I do constitute and appoint my son William Paul and John Paul executors to see that this my last will and testament be truly and faithfully fulfilled. According to the true intent and meaning of the author, given under my hand this third day of September, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Two.

 Just debt and my body to the debt to be entered at the discretion of my Executors
 I do Impower my Executors to vend all my property and Plantations with Stock of all
 kinds and every thing I possess and the sum or sums the same does amount to be
 divided Equally betwixt my wife and Children Each Share to have alike, only
 I allow my Executors to give to my wife whatever they think Necessary for the Rearing
 of the young Child that is yet unborn if she keep it to be one or two years old, and
 if not they do as they think proper. I do appoint for my lawful Executors James
 Lyons & Willm. Adger and David Florin and I Impower them to do as they think
 best and fitting in every line besides. I have them this my last will and testament
 having the whole management with any Entering in Court or any Employing of
 any man of any kind unless they think proper. Given under my hand and seal this
 17th day of June in the year of our Lords one thousand Eight hundred and One

 about the place With this Condition that the said John Paul is to pay
 the Sums annexed to every ones Name. I also give to my daughter Mary
 ret Russell Swin Bonds, Also I give to my Son James Paul's Children
 the land at the entrance, I also give to the constituted Society in Vir-
 ginia for the use of building a meeting House ten dollars, AND I do hereby
 constitute and appoint my Son William Paul and John Paul Executors
 to see that this my last Will and testament be truly and faithfully fulfilled.
