COOKEVILLE — Bradley Wayne Bingham, 50, of Cookeville, was born Oct. 30, 1967, in Crossville. He passed away Feb. 21, 2018. He entered his heavenly home after a long hard battle with ALS (Lou Gehrig's Disease).
