Every October – as the leaves begin to turn – former students at the Buffalo Valley School gather for their annual reunion. And about 100 of them gathered again Saturday, October 7, at the school built in 1929, and it was a magnificent autumn day which helped accentuate the warm fellowship so evident on the special occasion.

They came from throughout Putnam County and across the state, and from many far distant places out of state, renewing friendships cemented in years gone by. And they were a bit older, but there were sons and daughters present, together with grandchildren, all of it combining to make it a sparkling occasion.

On hand was Mrs. Lorraine H. Maddux who once served as principal of the four-room school which taught students in grades one through eight.

In addition to the classrooms, the school, now a community center, had an auditorium and small stage where school programs were conducted. Still on the stage is a curtain with the names of businesses and individuals who sponsored the curtain. There in the squares were the names of the old First National Bank and Citizens Band and Marchbanks Drug Store, and Z. D. Medley, who had a general store at Buffalo Valley.

Mrs. Maddux said she helped sell the ads that emblazon the stage curtain.

Earnest Whitehead of Baxter was also present, and he recalled how, in days past, he used to cut the grass in the large lot in front of the school for hay.

The group enjoyed dishes of home-cooked food and were offered a multitude of tempting desserts.

And, as a reminder of a pleasant time now gone, from the auditorium window the former students could look at the see-saw, still in place – and if they wanted to, could recall the fun it provided during recess from the school books.
