JOHN ALLISON, JR. was born 1762 in Orange County, N. C. and died 28 March 1842, in White County, Tennessee (Putnam County). He married Sarah Tollar on 16 April 1787. John Allison, Jr., served as a private, North Carolina Troops in 1778. His children were as follows:

John Allison Jr. came to Tennessee in the early 1800's and many of his descendents live in the Putnam County area.

On November 4, 1939 Mr. Byrd P. Allison, then of Gallatin, Tennessee, wrote of his grandfather's family, Joseph Allison (No. 6 above) as follows:

 - c. Byrd P., b. 27 Apr 1872
 - d. Rebecca Jane, b. 5 July 1875, m. C. Exum of Buffalo Valley, Tn.

- Assenith, b. 18 Aug 1845, m. Payton "Pate" Harris. They are burned in the 16th district of Putnam County in Harris Graveyard.

LT. JOSEPH ALLISON was born in October 1750 in Orange County, N. C. and died

 Aug 1826 in Smith County, Tennessee. He married (1) a Donaldson and
Betsy Naddin. He too served in the American Revolution from North Carolina.
