



We the undersigned commissioners and surveyor being appointed by the court of Jackson County Tennessee to allot and assign unto Judith Anderson the widow of Thomas Anderson deceased her dower out of all the lands that the said Anderson died seized and possessed in the county and state aforesaid after being duly sworn and surveying said lands we have proceeded upon the duties entrusted to us and have laid off and assigned unto the said Judith Anderson what we consider in our opinions to be one third part of all the said deceased lands in value including the mansion and out houses as shown in the platt above.

Beginning at a buckeye stump & beech running thence south 186 32 poles to a rock at the center of the fence, thence with the fence 776 20 poles to a rock, thence north 836 54 poles to a stake; thence south 206 58 poles to a barnbeam, thence east 108 poles to a beech in the east boundary line,

thence north 46 poles to a spanish oak thence west 8 poles to a black gum thence north with said line 60 poles to a beech, thence west 75 poles with the north boundary line to a stake on the bank of the creek, thence south 8 poles to a oak, then north  $79 \frac{1}{2}$  to 86 poles to a spanish oak stump on the north bank of the creek, thence west 20 poles to a sugartree & hornbeam, Paul Anderson's corner, thence south 50 w. with a conditional line between Paul Anderson and his father, 32 poles to a hornbeam thence thence south crossing the creek 6 poles to the beginning, this 25<sup>th</sup> day of March 1859.
