During those years he was the primary sponsor of the Tennessee Water and Safety Act, which controls and regulates boats on the public waters of Tennessee. He was very active and a longtime member of First United Methodist Church, having served 30 years on the board of trustees, of which he was chairman for 26 years.

His family includes his wife, Mary Jo Puckett; a daughter and son-in-law, Linda and Walter Whitson Carlen of Cookeville; a daughter-in-law, Katherine Smith Puckett of Naples, Fla.; a stepdaughter, Merle Sandlin; eight grandchildren, Henry Puckett, Stephanie Eby, Mary Puckett, Jerri Brown, Polly Billiu, Malinda Carlen Little and Whit Carlen; a stepgranddaughter, Jenny Saul; and six great-grandchildren.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his first wife, Alvilda Shanks Puckett, and a son, Dr. Jerry E. Puckett.
