Edward Lynn Anderson, youngest child of Johnny William Anderson and Ila Mae Chaffin Anderson; born at their home on July 14, 1947 in Jackson County, Tennessee; educated in public schools of Jackson County, TN before graduating from Freed-Hardeman College (Henderson, Tennessee) in 1967 and David Lipscomb College (Nashville, Tennessee) in 1969; married July 17, 1966 to Barbara Helen Dixon (b. January 20, 1946), the only child of William Bedford Dixon and Emogene Graham Dixon of the Gladdice Community, Jackson County.

They have 2 daughters, Amanda Faith Anderson (b. July 27, 1971 in Indianapolis, Indiana), and Aletha Hope Anderson (b. May 20, 1978) in Gainesboro, Tennessee.

Edward became a Christian and preached his first sermon at age fourteen (14) at Antioch Church of Christ, Flynn's Creek, Jackson County; preached by appointment throughout high school for various Churches of Christ in Jackson County; served as minister of Bagdad Church of Christ, Jackson County (1966-1970), Park Avenue Church of Christ, Indianapolis, Indiana (1970 – 1973), Monterey Church of Christ, Monterey, Tennessee (1973-1976), and Carthage Church of Christ (1976-present); conducts an average of six (6) evangelistic meetings per year; has written articles appearing in religious periodicals; has spoken on lectureships programs with lectures appearing in lectureship books; enjoys part-time farming, writing poetry, playing guitar, sports; currently resides in the Tanglewood Community near Carthage, Tennessee.
