Mamaw Powell as I knew her, is buried with her son Dewey and his wife Mae at the Oak Grove Cemetery Rockwood Roane Co., TN.

BIOGRAPHY: MAMAW POWELL: Dorinda Jane JACQUESS is buried at Shiloh Cemetery in Jackson Co TN. She was the mother of Leotha Ann Anderson Burris Young Powell, who was born 19 March 1875 in Jackson Co., TN. Annie, as she was known, died 15 April 1963 at my home on Nelson St. in Rockwood Roane Co TN. She is buried at Oak Grove Cemetery Section N1 with her son Dewey and his wife, Callie Mae Shipley Burris. Annie, was the daughter of David Silas Anderson born 13 March 1852. He was murdered 18 August 1889 by the brother of his wife who was Isaac Jacquess. I met "Mammaw Powell" in 1953 when I was dating her grandson Carl Shipley Burris. After Carl and I married I got to know and love her very much. She would talk to me and tell me about her life. She loved my children, Carson and Teresa, and spoiled them. My daughter Dorinda was born after Mamaw's death and named after Mamaw's mother Dorinda and my sister Sue. Mamaw Powell told me her father was only 35 years old when he was murdered. A steer belonging to Isaac Jacquess was loose and tramped the garden of Silas Anderson who in turn put the steer up to make Mr. Jacquess pay for the damage. He refused and a fight ensued. Mr. Jacquess was charged with first degree murder but claimed self-defense. The family of Mr. Anderson said he didn't even carry a pocket knife. The trial lasted a long time and was finally dropped. Jacquess was set free. Several years later Mr. Jacquess was on a horse at the Putnam Co. fair at Cookeville TN. The two younger brothers of David Silas Anderson, Thomas and Henry walked up to Mr. Jacquess and ask him "Are you the man that killed our brother? He said "Yes, I am the man that HAD to kill your brother". They shot him dead, pulled him off the horse and stomped his body in the ground! They joined hands and walked away. One brother was purported to have lost his mind. David Silas Anderson is buried near a church about 8-10 miles from Cookeville TN. The tombstone has "MURDERED' written on the front.

There is a newspaper article relating to the murder of Isaac Daniel Jacquess, brother-in-law of David Silas Anderson, Henry Clay Anderson & Thomas "Tom" Shirley Anderson. David Silas Anderson was killed by Isaac Daniel Jacquess, brother to his wife Dorinda Jane Jacquess.

David Silas Anderson's brothers, Henry Clay Anderson & Thomas "Tom" Shirley Anderson killed Isaac Daniel Jacquess and were brought to trial for murder.

From a Lebanon, TN paper of 1895 about a murder--Henry and Tom killed Mr. Jacquess (Isaac Daniel Jacquess).

Lebanon Democrat October 10 1895 f.p. Released on Bail Henry and Tom Anderson Charged with the Killing of Mr. Jacquess

Henry and Tom Anderson of Putnam County who are charged with the killing of Isaac Jacquess of Cumberland County at or near Cookeville on Friday September 27 and who were brought to Lebanon and lodged in the jail here last week, there being no jail in Cookeville, were brought before J.S. Gribble under habeas corpus proceedings last Friday. ----- from the evidence produced , the killing seemed to be a clear case of self defense-----admitted the young men to bail of \$5000.-----
