

WILL OF GARLAND ANDERSON

November the 13th in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and forty nine I Garland Anderson of the County of Jackson State of Tennessee planter do make and publish this my last will and Testament first I direct that my body be decently entered in a manner suitable to my condition in life and as to such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to entrust me with I dispose of the same as follows First I will and bequeth to be beloved wife Sarah all my Landed estate during her natural life

Secondly three Negroes of her choice (vs) Lewis Andrew & Kit and if Kit or either of the others should die or become infirm my said beloved wife Sarah has the priviledge of making another choise or if either of them become unworthey or disobediand servents she has the priviledge and is by this my will authorized to make choise of another or others to fill the place of the unworthy or disobediand servant or serveuts

Thirdly I will to my said beloved wife Two hundred dollars out of any money that may be due to me or that may be made out of my estate by sale of property or otherwise so that she obtains the above sum of Two hundred Dollars

Fourthly, I will to my said beloved wife all my household & kitchen furniture or as much as she may see cause to keep all of which Landed and other property is willed to her my said beloved wife Sarah during her natural life

Fifthly, I also will to my said beloved wife Two choise horses a wggon and our yoke of oxen and as many Cows Hogs & Sheep as she may see proper to keep all of, which shall be of her choice.

Sixth my will is that all my children have an equal share of my estate with the exception that my sons have each one hundred Dollars more than my Daughters for the reason that I was at expenses in the Store for my Daughters which I was not for my sons and I think it will take that much to make them eaquel and as I have divided off to them both sons and daughters in property and money I have charged it to them in a book account in my own hand writing which charge I want to be a part or whole of each one of my Childrens part of my estate and if either of there accounts amount of more than their equal part according to the one hundred Dollars allowd to my sons over and above the amount allowed to my Daughters that such of them having received such amount over there equeal share as above named shall be bound to pay back such overpluss into the general stock to be eaqually divided as above at my death what ever amount of property may be over what I have willed to my wife I wish to be sold and the money arising from said sale and the amount of money which may be on hand over what I have willed to my wife I wish to be divided among my Children agreeable to the above araingment between my Sons and Daughters so that each may have there proportionable share at the time if there be a sufficiency to do so And if there is not a sufficiency at that time that it be done as near as propiable and remain so untill the death of my wife after which I wish the ballance of my estate sold both real and personal and the proceeds thereof divided among all my Childrin as above allowing to my sons in the whole dividend one hundred dollars each more than each of my Daughters

Item 7th the Boy Wilson that I let my Daughter Polly Loveall have I will to her and the hieres of her body allowing the price Charged against her for him in my Book account to be so much of her part of my estate

Shirley and Joel Anderson, along with the Edward Robinson Family. He settled
