
James Kenneth (Kenny) Birdwell Obt.

*Donald B. Birdwell, b. 28 January 1909 – d. 9 February 1976, s/o Fred Monroe Birdwell & Susan "Susie" Garrison.

*Era Estell Maxwell Birdwell, b. 25 December 1911 – d. 1 March 1995, d/o David Wood Maxwell & Donna Wilkerson.

Susan "Susie" Garrison Birdwell, b. 30 September – d. 3 January 1946, d/o Malburn "Mack" Addison Garrison & Elizabeth "Betty" Anderson. She was the w/o Fred Monroe Birdwell, s/o John Harvey Birdwell Jr. & Martha Jane Kirby.

*Lex Garrison, b. 7 May 1874 – d. 29 May 1952, Malburn "Mack" Addison Garrison & Elizabeth "Betty" Anderson.

FOX FAMILY CEMETERY, Civil Dist. 12, Jackson Co., TN

From Gainesboro take Hwy 56 go toward Baxter. Turn right on Flynn's Creek Road. At the bottom of the hill turn left on the Flatt & Dyer Road. Cemetery is on the left up on a hill. Cemetery has also been called Fox and Chaffin.

Fred Monroe Birdwell, b. 20 December 1876, TN – d. 16 March 1917 (Fred Monroe Birdwell is listed in Jackson Co., TN Cemetery book as having been married 3 times). (Husband of Susan "Susie" Garrison Birdwell)

Pine Hill Cemetery Cummins Mill Road, Jackson Co., TN, located from Gainesboro take Hwy 56 going toward Baxter. Turn left on Hwy 290 going toward Cookeville. Turn left on Cummins Mill Road. Cemetery is located between Hwy 135 and old Hwy 56. About 1 ½ mile from Allen's Store. This cemetery is in the woods a short distance from the road. It is on your right and at the top of the hill after crossing the bridge over Blackburn Fork Creek.

*Malburn A. "Mack" Garrison, b. 2 November 1834 – d. 24 October 1892

Note: On Sept. 7, 1861, Malburn Garrison joined the Confederate Army. He was assigned to the 2nd Mountain Regiment, Tennessee Volunteers. On Oct. 3, 1861, the outfit became Company B., 28th Regiment, Tennessee Infantry, and he was made 2nd sergeant. By March 4, 1864, he left the army and acquired a farm in Jackson County on Blackburn's Fork Creek. in 1867, he married Elizabeth "Betty" Anderson (b. in 1851), daughter of Paul Thomas (b. 1821; d. 1866) and Susmath "Susie" Johnson Anderson. Elizabeth's brothers and sisters were Josephine, Martha, Minervia, Frances, Thomas, William J., and Robert. Children born to Malburn and Elizabeth were Prudy (1868), Lucetta (1869), Luther (1872), Lex (1874), Ava (1867)(?BYB), Susan (1878), Fred (1880), Lee (1883), Mont (1884), Cora (1887), Lizzie (1889), and Addison (1892). The family lived on Blackburn Fork Creek where Malburn farmed and Elizabeth was a homemaker. Their lives were full and happy. Malburn died in

1892, and Elizabeth died in 1909. Both are buried in the Cummins Mill Cemetery.

*Elizabeth "Betty" Anderson Garrison, b. 5 March 1851 – d. 18 March 1909, d/o Paul Thomas Anderson, s/o (Thomas Shirley Anderson & Judith Robison) & Susmath "Susie" Johnson.
