

Albert Overton Birdwell Obt.

Albert Birdwell died at the home of his son, Wm. Birdwell, in Nashville on March 26, 1925, following a lingering illness. Age 69 years. He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Mary Ann Birdwell and 7 children: Mrs. T. D. West of near Gainesboro, Mrs. Morgan Lock of the 12th district, Mrs. Frank Haile of Dry Fork, Mrs. Martha Brown, Albany, KY; and Mrs. Laura Wright, Nashville; Lawrence Birdwell of Detroit; and Johnnie Birdwell whose whereabouts are unknown. Also a brother, T. E. Birdwell of the 12th district and two sisters, Mrs. Sarah Jackson of Putnam County and Mrs. Tom Anderson of the 12th district.

Mr. Birdwell was born in Jackson County in the year 1856 and obeyed the gospel when 20 years old under the preaching of Rev. Cooper at Antioch Church and lived a faithful member until the end. In 1876, he was married to Miss Mary Ann Wheeler and to them ten children were born and all are living but three. All the children attended the funeral which was held at the Byers Cemetery, conducted by Elder John W. Fox.

Mary Ann Wheeler was born October 8, 1851 and was the daughter of Wm. Wade Wheeler and Mary Elizabeth (Brown) Wheeler.
