Take exit 280 off I-40. From the east turn right, from the west turn left onto Baxter Road. Go approximately 2.1 miles and turn left onto Ensor Creek Road. Where the road y's take the right onto Elrod. Go approximately 3/10 of a mile and the cemetery is fenced on the left.

The Grave of Joseph Allison 1 Dec 1799 - 5 Dec 1886, transcription on stone, Age 87 years and 4 days, makes this the third oldest cemetery in Putnam County, Tennessee.
