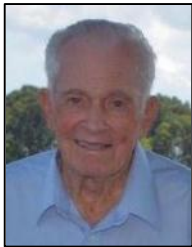

Maggie was 16 years old when her father was killed. She learned life skills and independence from her mother, Mary Susan. She became a good seamstress and an avid photographer. She would get flour and sugar in large sacks. She enjoyed quilting, especially the "wedding ring" pattern. She never threw out any pieces of material that could possibly be used for her quilts or clothes for us kids. Us girls had dresses she made from the flour and sugar sacks. Sometimes we would get sacks that had flower prints on them. These became extra special attire for the girls because they did have some print on them. As a photographer, Mother would take pictures as often as she could afford the film. Her camera was a big, bulky unit that required a "head cover" to keep from exposing the film. I remember one particular picture taking day was funny. Kelly didn't want his taken. Being the only boy, he was sick of the girls. Mother Martin lined us up anyway. Jo grabbed her cat by the neck and held on for dear life. We were gonna get spiffed up! Mother Martin told Lorry to get Kelly and me. We were decked out in our finest. Mother was always telling us to be still. This was impossible with Jo's cat squalling and scratching to be let loose. Mother Martin [grandmother] was dressing Jo in an orchid silk dress with ruffles at the neck, and me and Lorry were in black satin. Mother wanted us to look our best. Kelly had to wear his checked knickers with long white socks. His hair and shirt were both white. Momma said she couldn't see his face cuz he was too white. We were funny." (Letter from daughter, Vauta Mae 1985).

Named after his Great Uncle Joseph Lafayette Patton (born 8 Jan 1843 in Wilson County, TN). Mother gave birth to him atop a river bluff. During his lifetime, Fate was a farmer in the Falling Water area of Tennessee, later he became an elementary school teacher, a minister for the church of Christ, worked for a surveyor and supervised a window cleaning detail at Oakridge (home of the A-Bomb). While working at Oakridge, he broke his arm falling off a ladder. His farm was inherited from his mother in law, Mary Susan Martin. Fate and his family lived in a log cabin on Susan Martin's farm from 1916 until about 1940. After his wife's death in 1935, Fate left the child rearing to his mother in law. He raised livestock, pigs, cows, chicken and some garden items as well as feed for his animals. Fate began courting Estelle Fleming in early 1936 and married her 7/20/1938.

Within a period of just over an hour, Fate and his brother Alvie Patton each died of a heart attack. Death came to John Alvie Patton, 78, at 5:10 pm Nov 26, 1966 at Warren County General Hospital. Alvie was admitted to the hospital the night before after becoming ill at his home. Joseph "Fate" Patton, 71, was dead on arrival the McMinnville Medical Clinic at 6:30 pm Nov 26, 1966. He was rushed to the Clinic after being stricken at home. Both brothers were interned at the Whorton Springs, Cemetery, McMinnville, Tennessee.

Joseph built a playhouse near the barn for his children. Before moving to McMinnville, TN Martin/Austin farm was sold to the Landis Goff family.
