BAXTER TAKES OVER MAXWELL CEMETERY

BAXTER -- The town of Baxter has taken over one of the area's older family cemeteries, and its oversight could mean the lot will be closed off to any future burial plots.

Maxwell Cemetery, located on the corner of First Avenue and Highway 56 and overlooking the ever-growing Baxter Junction and Love's truck stop, was taken over last week after a 2-1 vote from the town's Mayor and Board of Alderman.

The board has been approached about the land before. Baxter Mayor Jeff Wilhite said the town could fence off the cemetery and use any

remaining land, although he also said there are no immediate plans for its development.

Fencing off the land would eliminate the possibility of any additional burial plots at the site.

"I don't think anybody has any particular plans for it," Wilhite said. "I think the fact that there was usable property there, where it was divided up, that's what made the board finally decide to take it."

A family representative, Bobby Palmer, who attended the meeting last week and requested the town take over the land, said it has been more than 25 years since anyone has purchased a plot at the site.

When a municipality takes over a cemetery, its list of duties often include the upkeep, weed eating and mowing. Wilhite said it costs the town roughly \$60 a month to maintain another city-owned cemetery located off First Avenue and Buffalo Valley Road.

"There are some problems that you run into, and that's just something the board considered," Wilhite said. "We actually had a list of things, but the board decided that was worth taking."

The cemetery land was given to Baxter by the same family that donated about an acre of land next to the future site for the Baxter fire hall, to be located on the corner of Fourth and Elm Street.

Wilhite said one deal was not contingent on the other.

Aldermen Robert Vinson and Harmon Garris voted for the motion, Richard Waller voted no and Brian Burgess was absent.
