Sudden Death of Judge Denny Sudden Summons For Judge Denny –

City Attorney of Cookeville and Prominent Citizen is Dead

Cookeville, Tenn., Sept. 12, 1911- **Judge T. L. Denny, one of the most prominent lawyers of this section of the state, died suddenly of heart failure at 9 o'clock last night at his home in this city.** His death came as a great shock to everyone. He was 60 years old and is survived by his wife and by five children by his first marriage, Mrs. H. M. Jared, Mrs. O. K. Holladay, Miss Clara Denny and Larimore Denny of this city, and Mrs. Will McCluen of Monterey.

Judge Denny had held the office of County Superintendent of Public Instruction and County Judge of this county and Mayor of this city and at the time of his death was City Attorney. He had frequently served as special Circuit Judge and Criminal Judge and had practiced his profession in all of the courts of this and the adjoining counties.

His first wife who before their marriage was Miss Frances Ford of this city died several years ago and he was married a second time to Mrs. Robertson of Mount Juliet, who survives him.

Funeral services for **Silas Dean Denny**, 80 who died at his home on Oak Street, Sunday night after a short illness, were conducted at the home Tuesday afternoon by the Rev. Dow A. Ensor. Burial took place in the Cookeville City Cemetery, *Cookeville, TN*.

Mr. Denny's death was a shock to his hundreds of friends in Cookeville and Putnam county, where he was well known. He had been in town Sunday afternoon and had started to his home after the Tennessee Central passenger train No. 1 had pulled out. Mr. Denny had met passenger trains almost daily for many years, and had appeared to be in excellent health Sunday afternoon when talking with friends at the depot. He was stricken when near his home, became worse later in the night, and died toward midnight.

He was a native of Putnam county, being born near Buffalo Valley, December 1, 1854, **the son of Jonathan and Agnes Winfree Denny**. He was educated in the public schools of the county, and early in life became a carpenter by trade. He moved to Cookeville about 40 years ago, and by his woodwork became known as one of the best carpenters and cabinet makers in the state.

He was married in 1879 to Miss **Molly Essex**, who died seventeen years ago. To this union three children were born, Walter Denny, Mrs. Gertrude Dillard, of Cookeville, Ed C. Denny, of Fort Worth, Texas. Walter Denny died here several years ago.

Mr. Denny became a member of the Methodist church when a young man, and had been a steadfast member until his death. He had been a member of the Cookeville, Lodge, I.O.O.F., for 34 years, joining in 1900 shortly after his removal to Cookeville.

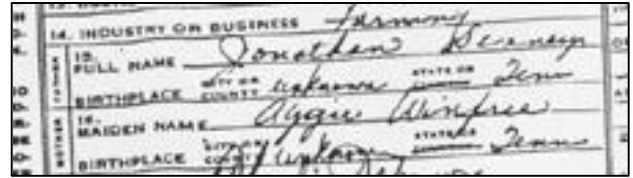

****At some point in 1864, Jonathan & his brother Timothy Denny was forced to take the oath of allegiance to the Union by an army patrol.**

During the 1863 and 1864 Civil War, an unknown Union officer stationed at Carthage kept a record of at least some of the Confederates that were forced to swear the oath of allegiance and post a bond that they would not aid the confederacy. The record was kept on some blank pages of a store ledger that had been confiscated and the individual dates of each event were not recorded, although the first pledge was listed as October 6, 1863. The men included were residents of Smith, Jackson, Putnam, and DeKalb counties.

John L. Huddleston of Putnam County [son-in-law of Zachariah and Catherine Stallings Denney. Huddleston is thought to have died during the war during Confederate Service so he may have broken his oath]. Bond for \$5000. His securities were Jesse Pickard and Jonathan Denney of Putnam County [Denney- was Huddleston's brother-in-law and son of Zachariah Denney].

William Haynes of Putnam County. Bond for \$5000. Securities were **Jesse Pickard** and **Jonathan Denney** of Putnam County.

Daniel Brown of Putnam County. Bond for \$5000. Securities were **Jesse Pickard** and **Jonathan Denney** of Putnam County.

Jesse Pickard of Smith County. Bond of \$5000. Securities were **Jonathan Denney** and **Daniel Brown** of Putnam County.

Jonathan Denney [son of Zachariah Denney] of Smith County. Bond for \$5000. Securities were **Jesse Pickard** and **Daniel Brown** of Putnam County.

Timothy Denney [son of Zachariah Denney] of Putnam County. Bond not specified. Securities were **Jonathan Denney** and **Jesse Pickard** of Smith County.

It is interesting to note that several of these men were listed as both of Smith and Putnam County. They lived in Buffalo Valley very near the line between the two counties. This area was particularly dangerous and was the local of severe guerilla warfare.

Preface: DeKalb County was created by an Act of the Tennessee Legislature in 1837 out of parts of White, Warren, Cannon, Wilson and Jackson Counties. It was named in honor of Baron Johann DeKalb who accompanied Lafayette to America in 1777. He was appointed a Major General in the Continental Army. He was killed at the Battle of Camden in 1780.

These deeds cover the period from August 1869 to October 1885. They should be interest to those with families in the above named counties, as well as Smith County.

Mary Frances (Curtis) Denny: pg. 167- Political Development, 1890-1920 – Putnam County Tennessee 1850-1970 by Mary Jean DeLozier: Though many community leaders now urged women to exercise the franchise, there was considerable apprehension over women holding political offices. The Herald Newspaper carried letters, reprints from other newspapers, and editorials reflecting this fear. **Mary F. Denny** was the first announced as candidate for the Democratic nomination for Putnam County trustee. **Mrs. Denny** had held clerical and secretarial positions in the postal service, Cookeville town government, and at TPI; but in her campaign she found it necessary to explain that she needed the public office because she was the sole support of her invalid husband and son and to deny a rumor that her husband received a pension. She asked, “Is there any reason why I should be defeated just because I am a woman? I am asking for this office in order that I can better care for a man who cannot care for himself.” **Mrs. Denny** won the nomination and the election and served two terms as trustee.²⁶
