He moved from NC to TN, probably with his brother, Jesse, about 1780, and settled near Dandridge, in what is now Jefferson Co., but at that time was Greene Co. He was married first, about 1783, to Mary Gentry, who died in 1784, the daughter of Robert Gentry, who lived east of Dandridge on the French Broad River. Robert Gentry gave him a farm near Dandridge where he lived for some time before moving to Mossy Creek Iron Works. Duke and Mary had one child, a daughter. **Duke** was married second in 1785, to Susan Hunter, born ca 1765, possibly in Washington Co., TN, and died ca 1794, in Jefferson Co. She was the daughter of **Isaac Hunter**, of Washington Co., TN, who may have been from Chowan Co., NC. Duke and Susan had five children, four sons and a daughter. Duke was married third in 1795 (the license was issued on 4 Aug 1795) to Eunice Carlock born 24 Oct 1770 in Augusta Co., VA, died 19 Mar 1856 in Jefferson Co., TN, and buried in the family graveyard, she was the daughter of John Christian (Hanchrist) Carlock and Sarah Whitman, of Augusta Co., VA. Duke and Eunice had nine children, six sons and three daughters. In Jan 1793 Duke was deeded 120 acres of land in Jefferson Co., by Joseph Garrison. In May 1794 and in 1795 he served on juries in Jefferson Co. On 8 Jul 1795, in Rowan Co., NC, Duke signed an indenture as one of the sons and heirs of Bradley Kimbrough, deceased. On 4 Jul 1797, he received NC land grant No. 362 for 100 acres on the south side of the Holston river at the head of Coss(?) Creek, in Greene (later Jefferson) Co., TN, as assignee of Martin Armstrong, who had surveyed the land. Eunice Carlock was an early member of the French Broad Baptist Church which was organized 23 Mar 1786, and for several years held its meetings at what was known as the Koonts' Meeting House, three miles northeast of Dandridge. Her name is the fifteenth name on the membership roll. Duke Kimbrough became a member later; his name is twenty-fifth on the roll. He was ordained by the French Broad Baptist Church in Oct 1797, became its pastor in Jul 1799, and continued as its pastor for fifty years, until his death in Aug 1849. He also served as pastor for the Dumplin Creek Baptist Church from Jan 1798 to May 1839. Remarks: He witnessed the will of a James Wright on 22 Feb 1793, in Jefferson Co. He and a John Kimbrough were executors of the will of another John Kimbrough probated on 12 Mar 1822, in Jefferson Co., witnesses were a Nicholas Davis and Jesse Kimbrough. The executors, Duke Kimbrough & John Kimbrough, returned an inventory of the estate to the court in Jun 1822. In Mar 1823, Duke was on a commission to view and lay off a road from New Market to the foot of the mountain at Flat Gap, and from there to the foot of the mountain near Charles Callen's field. Duke was on the tax lists for 1822 to 1829 in Jefferson Co.: 218 acres in Capt. Thornburgh's Co. for 1822, 1823, & 1824; 218 acres in Capt. Brazleton's Co. for 1826, 1827, 1828, & 1829. In Mar 1827 Duke was one of the jurors appointed to view and lay off a road from Nances Ferry to the Flat Gap on Bays Mtn. In the 1830 census for Jefferson Co., TN, there is a female, born 1815-1820, listed in Duke and Eunice's household that I cannot identify; she may have been a granddaughter.
