Record of the family of Gideon Wells born sometime in the year of our Lord 1805 and died 12 June 1868 and Alizabeth "Elizabeth" (Rinchelow) Wells born 4 October 1812 and d. 13 March 1881. They were married 10 November 1831 on Thursday.

The following was written in the Lewis Monroe Anderson Family Bible:



Byrd & Lucrecia Matelia "Creese" (Henley) Wells. She was the daughter of Aden Henley who lived in the Hopewell Community, of Tennessee.

William Bryd Wells was born February 21st, 1844 in Monroe County, Kentucky, in which place he lived until he was grown. He joined the Missionary Baptist Church about December 1865. He was married to Lucrecia "Creese" Henley on the 30th day of April, 1868. Made two crops in Monroe County on the widow Groams farm, thence moved to his own farm Tracy Barren County, Kentucky where he made two crops more, thence moved to Putnam County, Tennessee in the month of October A.D. 1872; on the place he purched of C.M. Shanks and on the 18th of December 1876,

he moved to the Moses Whitehead place. Where he now lives (1879) He also moved out to his new house (Smellage place) on the 22 day of December 1898.

(C. M.) Craven Michael Shanks is the brother-in-law, husband of Nancy Catherine Hendley. Smellage place is now the Smellage Cemetery, Boma, TN. At the end of the Civil War an early Upper Cumberland resident with the colorful name of Jephtheh Smellage donated 1.3 acres for public burial. Mr. Smellage was charging a \$1.00 a piece for a cemetery plot and had a free burial section with no reservations. In early 1865, a Henley baby, named Margaret Elizabeth Henley, became the first person buried there. In March of the same year, the donator of the land himself died and was buried, soon to be followed by his wife Eleanor. The couple was, incidentally, the grandparents of John B. Smellage. The cemetery is maintained by Ted Huddleston.

Monroe County, KY is on the TN line due north of Dekalb and Putnam Counties.

Barren County is northwest and bordering Monroe Co, KY and Glasgow is the central and main town.

1880 census for Civil District of Putnam County, TN shows Byrd Wells, parents born in KY and Lucrecia Matelia (Hendley) his wife. Lucrecia's father was born in

GA and her mother in TN. The 1880 census shows that they lived in the 11th Civil District of Putnam Co., TN. Listed with them is the daughters of McDonald Wallace & Juliann "Julia" Ann Henley: Matilda & Nancy Wallace. Raised by Lucretia Matelia "Creese" (Henley) & William Byrd Wells, because their mother died shortly after her birth and their father died when Matilda was four years old.

They lived in Buffalo Valley on Indian Creek and up the hill on the same road as Virgil Timothy & Audra Camilla (Anderson) Denny. This road is where Matelia first saw and met Lewis Monroe Anderson her future husband as a child. His mother Micheal Elizabeth (Alexander) Anderson was bringing him to town to have a suit of clothes made for him. William Byrd Wells taught school and Matilda was schooled at home due to her weak heart she couldn't attend school some of the time.

They had no children of their own but raised three orphan children two daughters of McDonald Wallace & Juliann "Julia" Ann Henley. They took good care of Malitda Isabelle Wallace, w/o Lewis Monroe Anderson; William Garfield Gentry – s/o Matilda Elizabeth Hendley who md William Gentry: and Nancy Josephine "Josie" Wallace w/o Silas Foster "Sil" Maddux. William Byrd Wells came to Putnam Co., TN in ca. 1872, where he purchased a farm from Craven Shanks, Nancy (Shanks) Hendley's husband Byrd Wells *See obituary for Lucretia (Henley) Wells.
