ESQUIRE CHARLES M. HUDDLESTON DIES AT RESIDENCE NEAR ALGOOD.

Was One of the Most Successful Farmers of County and Had an Unusually Wide Acquaintance.

Esquire Charles M. Huddleston died Sunday morning of pneumonia at his home near Algood. He had been ill only a few days and his death came as a great shock to his friends generally few of whom aside from his immediate neighbors, knew of his illness.

He was one of the most successful farmers of Putnam county, and was a splendid citizen who enjoyed the confidence and esteem of all who knew him.

He was about sixty years old and had spent his entire life in Putnam county. He was twice married. He is survived by his second wife and by several children, the issue of his last marriage, also by one brother, William P. Huddleston, a prominent farmer of the Third civil district of this county.

The deceased was the owner of the ancestral farm of his mother's family, "White Plains," one of the prettiest country places in this county. This farm originally belonged to his maternal great-grandfather, William Pennington Quarles (1752-1814), a Lieutenant in the Revolutionary war, and since he settled there, 117 years ago, this farm has remained in its original owner, the farm has been owned by someone of his descendants.

For a number of years, the deceased was a member of the county from the 19th civil district. Aside from his family, he leaves many other relatives and a host of friends in this county who are grieved over his death.
