Funeral Monday for Charles Stanton Sr.

Funeral services were held Monday afternoon for Charles Sanders Stanton Sr., 61, at the Methodist Church. The Rev. Thornton Fowler, the Rev. Bruce Strother and the Rev. S. D. Organ officiated at the services.

Mr. Stanton, long time telephone company employee died of a heart attack Saturday night while attending the Tennessee Tech Fort Campbell football game on Overall Field.
