BAXTER -- Funeral services for **Delton F. Dyal**, 53, of Baxter will be held Wednesday, Feb. 13, at 1 p.m. at Jefferson Ave. Church of Christ.

Mr. Dyal died peacefully Sunday, Feb. 10, 2008, at his residence, surrounded by his loving family.

Mr. Dyal married his true love, the former Cindy Medley, on June 12, 1976.

In addition to his wife and parents, his family includes a daughter and son-in-law, Valerie Dyal and Dustin Loftis; a sister and brother-in-law, Sharon and Jim Robinson of Baxter; a special pet companion, Dan; and several nieces, nephews, uncles and aunts.

He was preceded in death by a niece, Jennifer Robinson, and his mother-in-law, Vallie Phillips Medley.
