## JAMES BARTLETT DIES AT DRY VALLEY HOME:

Funeral services for James Bartlett, 82, prominent citizen of the Dry Valley section, and one of Putnam County's most highly respected men, were conducted at the Dry Valley church Sunday afternoon by the Rev. G. W. Pennington, the Rev. J. H. Roberson, and the Rev. J. W. Stone. Burial took place in the family cemetery.
