Double funeral services were held Wednesday at the First Baptist Church for Mr. and Mrs. John William DuBois with the Rev. Bob N. Ramsay, assisted by the Rev. J. Harold Stevens, officiating. Burial was in the family cemetery at Smith's Chapel in Cumberland County. Services at the grave were held at 1:00 p.m.

Mrs. Alcy Angel DuBois, 72, who died early Sunday morning was a daughter of the late Nicholas and Sarah Angel. Mrs. DuBois was born and reared in England's Cove near the Putnam-White County line. Mrs. DuBois was an active member of the First Baptist Church so long as her health permitted being a teacher of the Homemaker's Sunday School class for several years.

Mr. DuBois' death occurred early Tuesday morning having been in failing health for almost one year. He was born in Kentucky but spent most of his early life in the Glade Creek community just across the Putnam line in White County.

For a number of years Mr. DuBois was engaged in the lumber business and farming in White County. In 1929 he came to Cookeville and erected a bulk plant near the Tennessee Central Railroad track on the Hilham Road for the wholesale distribution of Texaco products. Associated with him in the business were two sons, Jack and Curtis DuBois.

Mr. DuBois was also a devoted member of the First Baptist Church at Cookeville.

Survivors: Two sons, Jack and Curtis DuBois, both of Cookeville; two daughters, Mrs. C. L. Hedgecoth, Jacksonville, FL, and Mrs. Alvin Vaughn, Alpine, TN.

Mr. DuBois survivors: one brother, Charles O. DuBois of Madison, TN.

Mrs. DuBois is survived by four brothers, Jesse D. and Fred Angel, Sparta, Ed Angel, Jasper, Joe Angel, Beards Ford, WV.

Eleven grandchildren and one great grandchild also survives.
