Civil War Veteran Answers to "Taps"

L. J. Whiteaker, 89, one of the dwindling rank of Putnam County's Civil War Veterans, died at his home in the 10th Civil Dist. April 10 after an illness of a week. Funeral services were conducted at the Bethany Church by the Rev. Dow A. Ensor and the Rev. Elisha Henry of Mulberry, and burial took place in the family cemetery. (Leige Whiteaker Graveyard, Putnam Co., TN, located approximately 12 miles west of Cookeville, just off Hwy 70 at the Whiteaker homeplace, near Cole's store).
