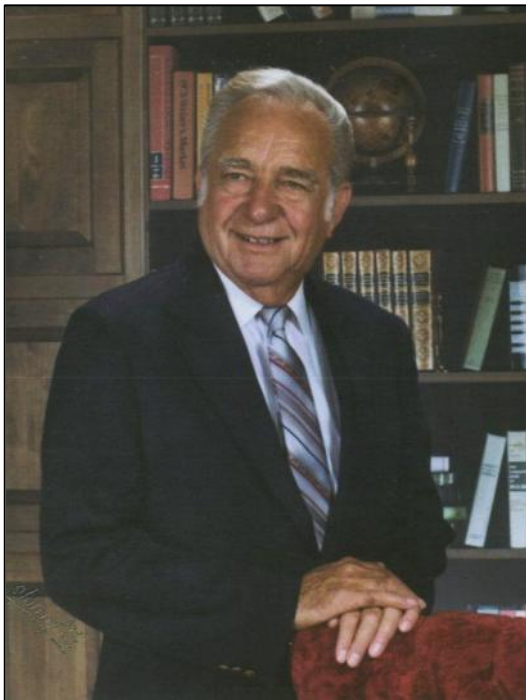


Thomas Whitley Amonette Obt.

Services were conducted by Bro. Thomas Baines on Saturday morning from the Carthage Chapel of Anderson Funeral Home. Burial following the 11:00 a.m. service was in the Smith County Memorial Gardens.

Born Thomas Whitley Amonette on September 26, 1920 in the Buffalo Valley community of Putnam County, he was the son of the late Thomas Napoleon and Sadie Cardwell Amonette.

Mr. Amonette was preceded in death on August 15, 1972 by his wife of twenty five years and the mother of his children, Rockwood native Jane Evans Amonette. He

was also preceded in death by a sister, Edith Carney and a brother Frank Amonette.

On November 15, 1974 he was married to the former Virginia Holder of Bowling Green, OH.

In addition to serving as Clerk and Master from 1963 through 1985, Mr. Amonette was also retired owner of the Amonette Insurance Agency in Carthage.

Mr. Amonette was a 1938 graduate of Carthage High School. He was an Army veteran of World War II. He served three tours of duty from September 17, 1940 thru November 24, 1945. He was a member of the American Legion and V.F.W. in Smith County and a charter member of the South Carthage Civitan Club.

Surviving in addition to his wife of over twenty seven years are two children, Jane Anne Kendall and husband, C. R. of Marietta, GA, David Amonette of Marietta, GA; five grandchildren, John and Mary Kendall of Marietta, GA, Evans, Sam and Jack Amonette, all of HI.
