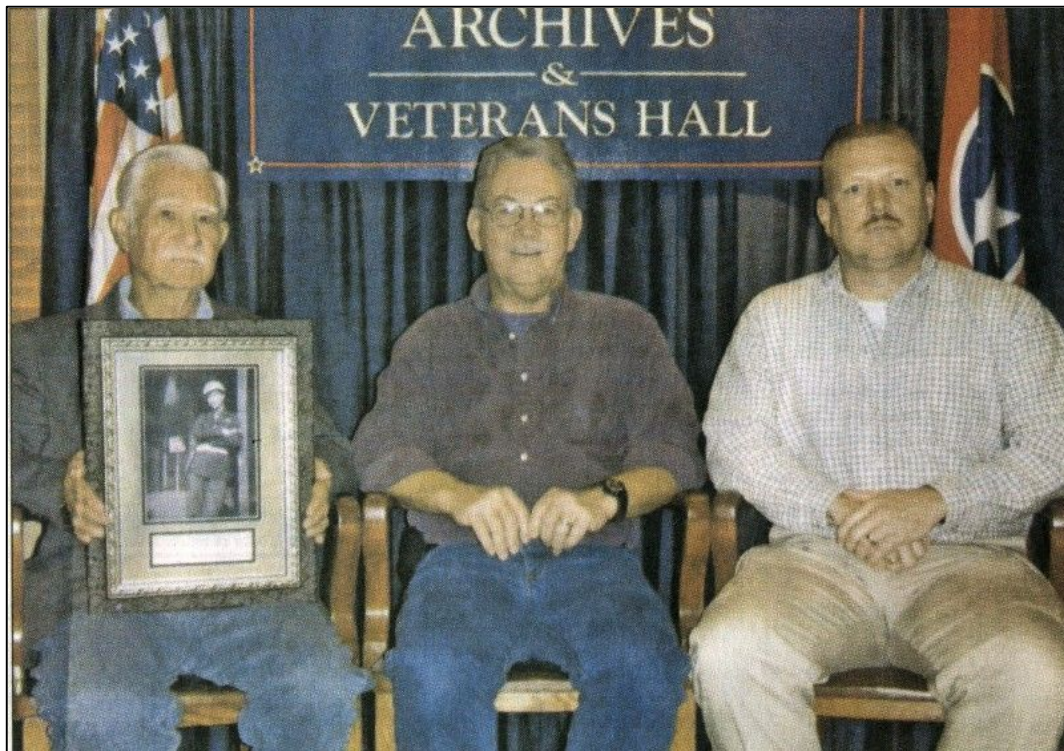

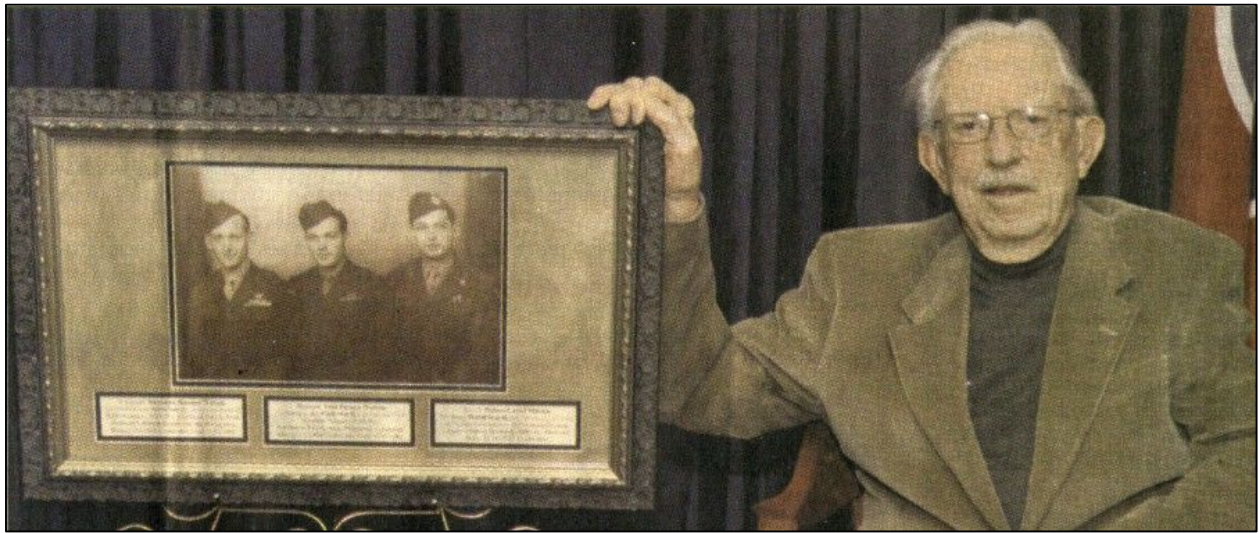

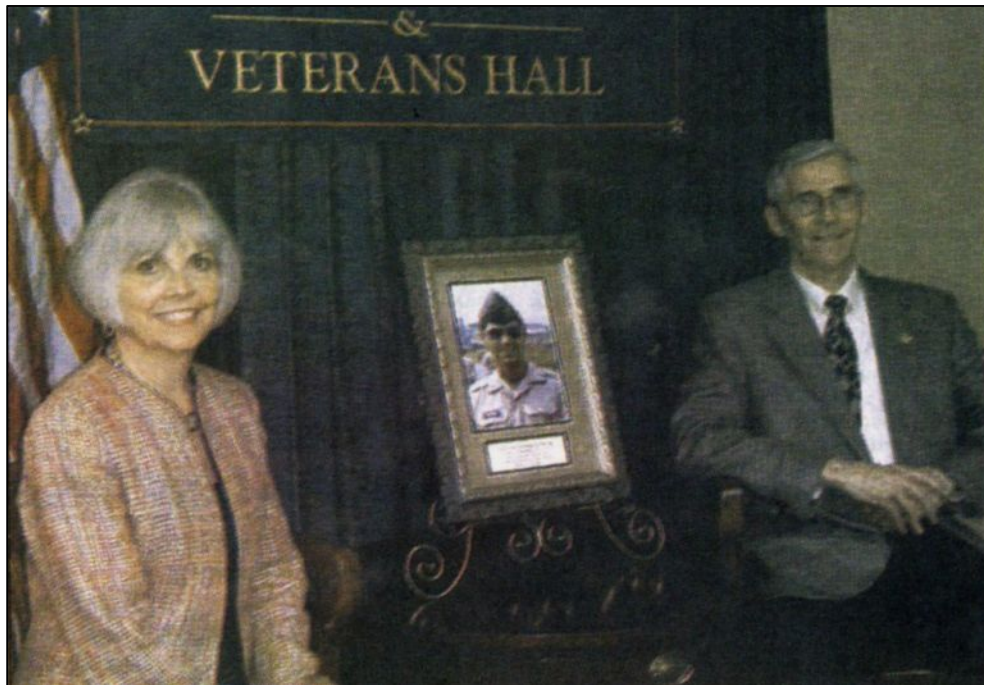


ARMY PFC CHARLIE CLEVELAND SULLINS

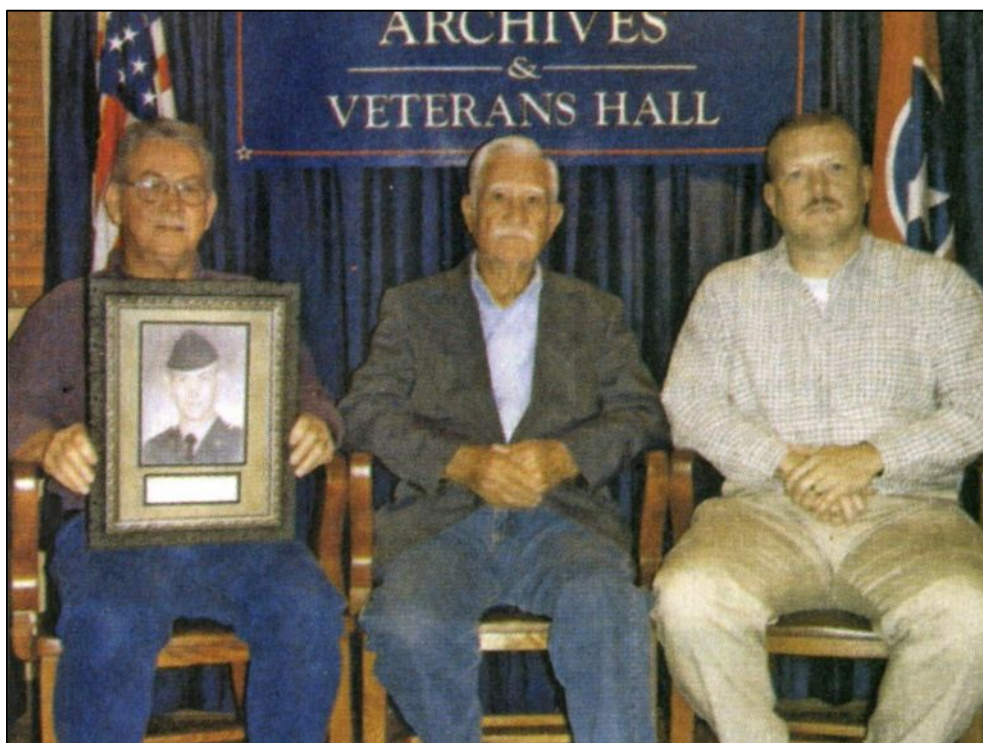

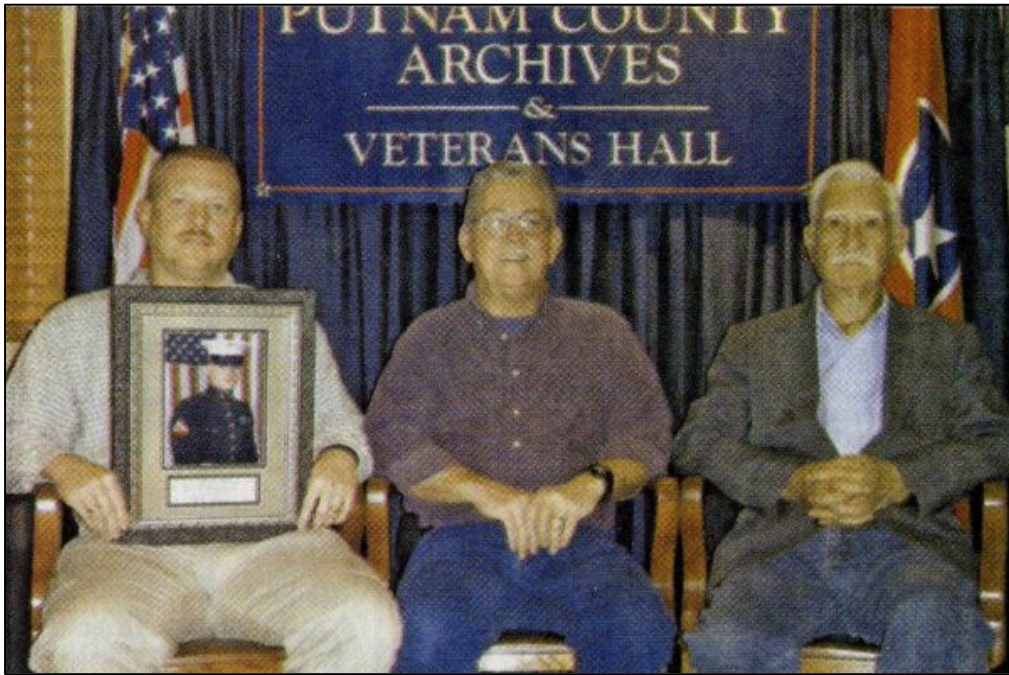

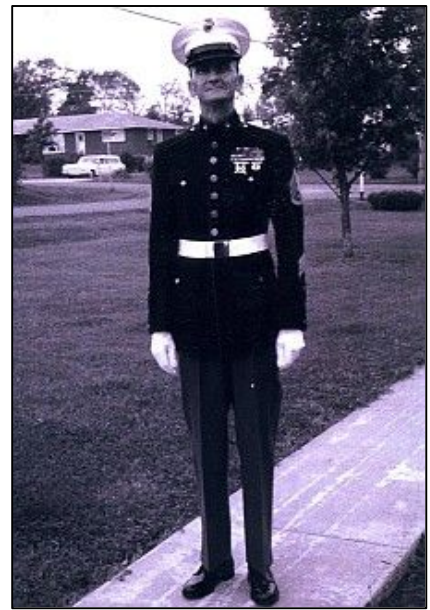

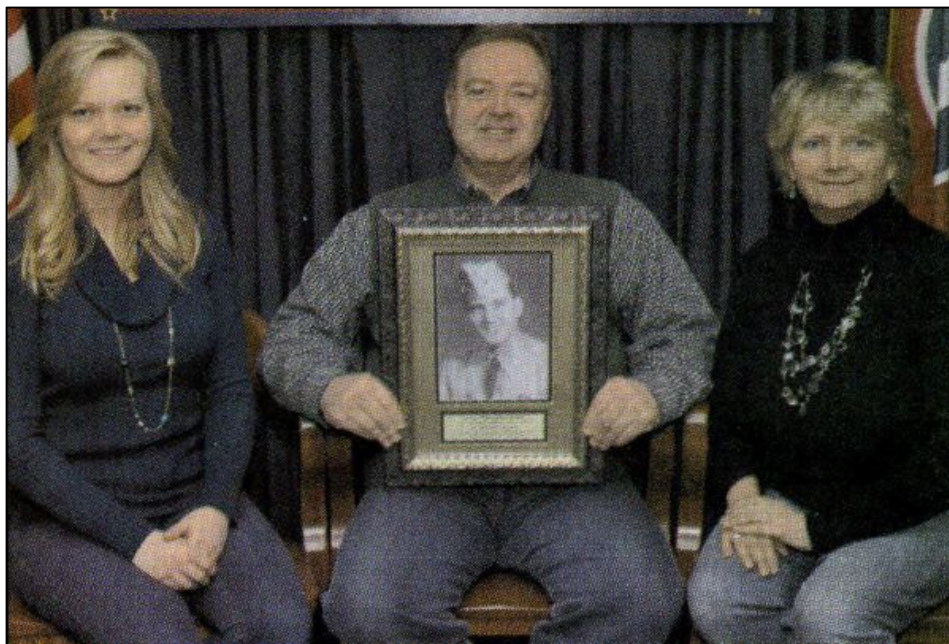

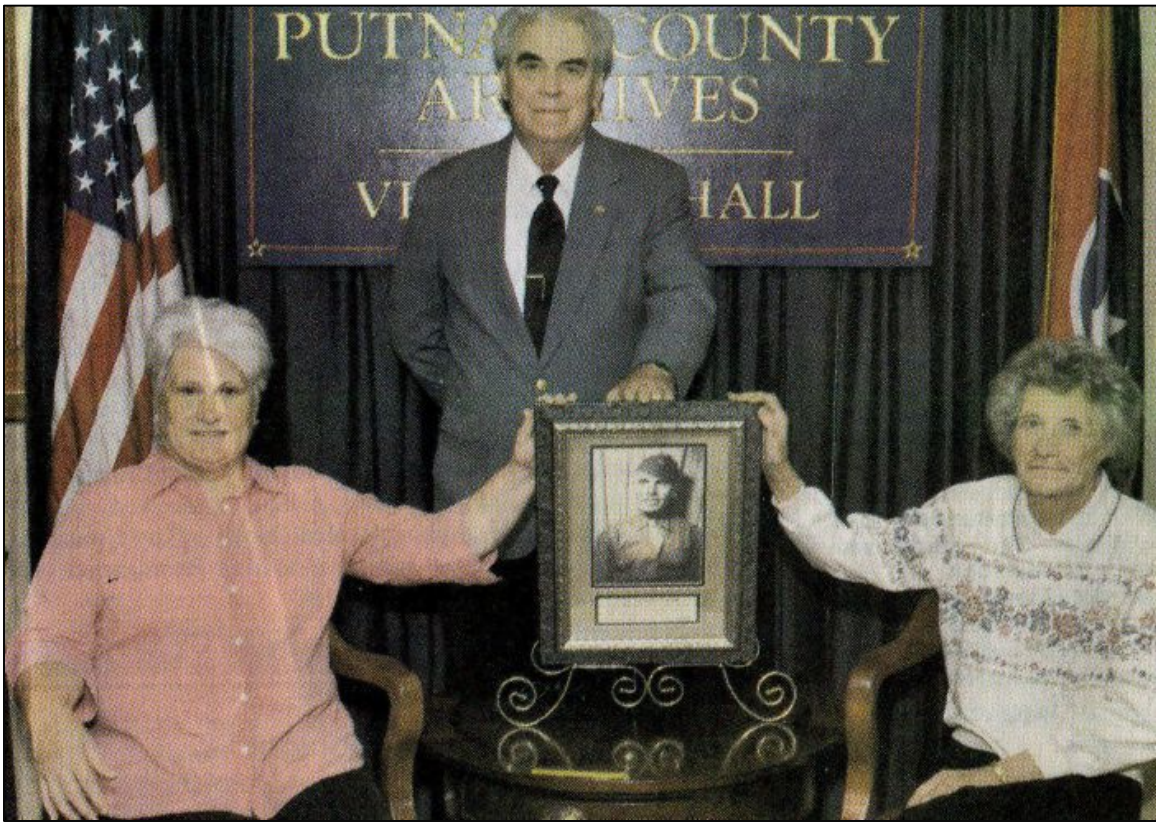

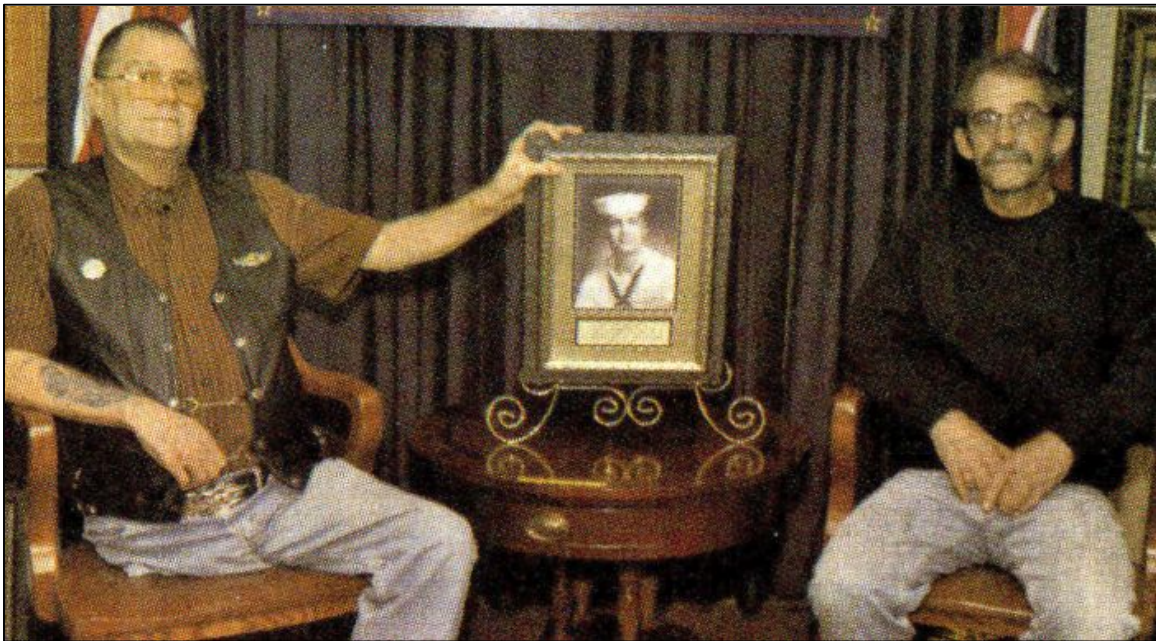

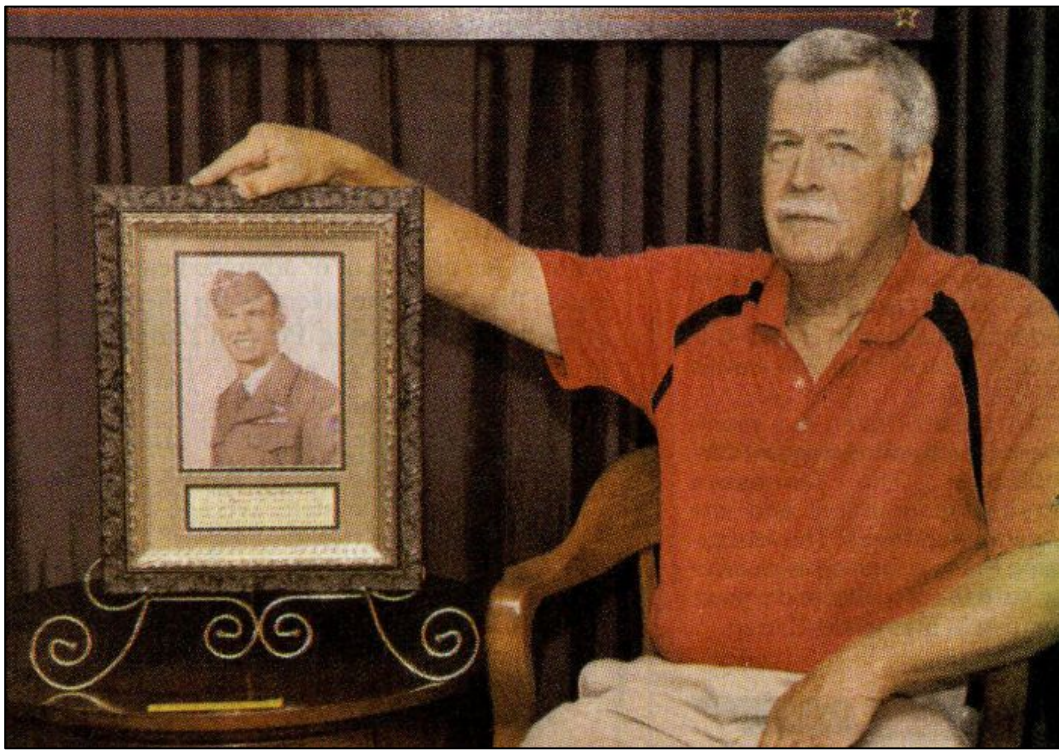

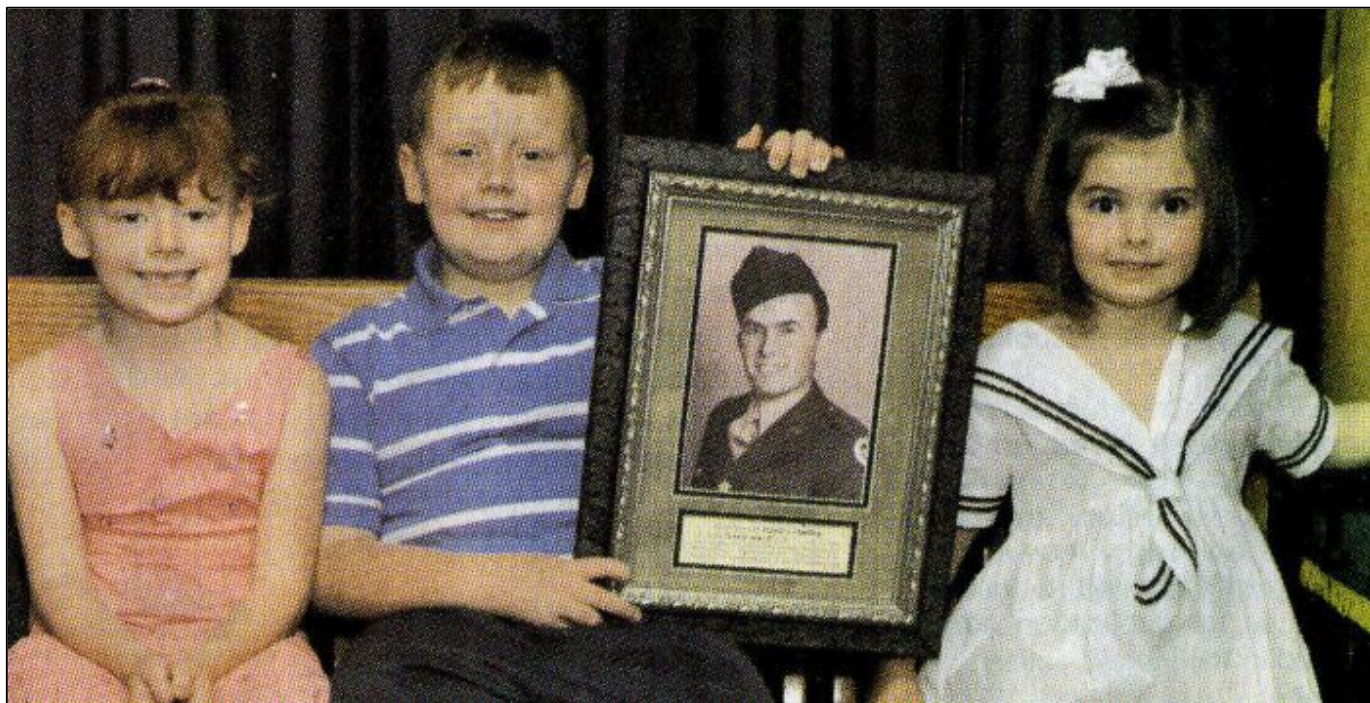

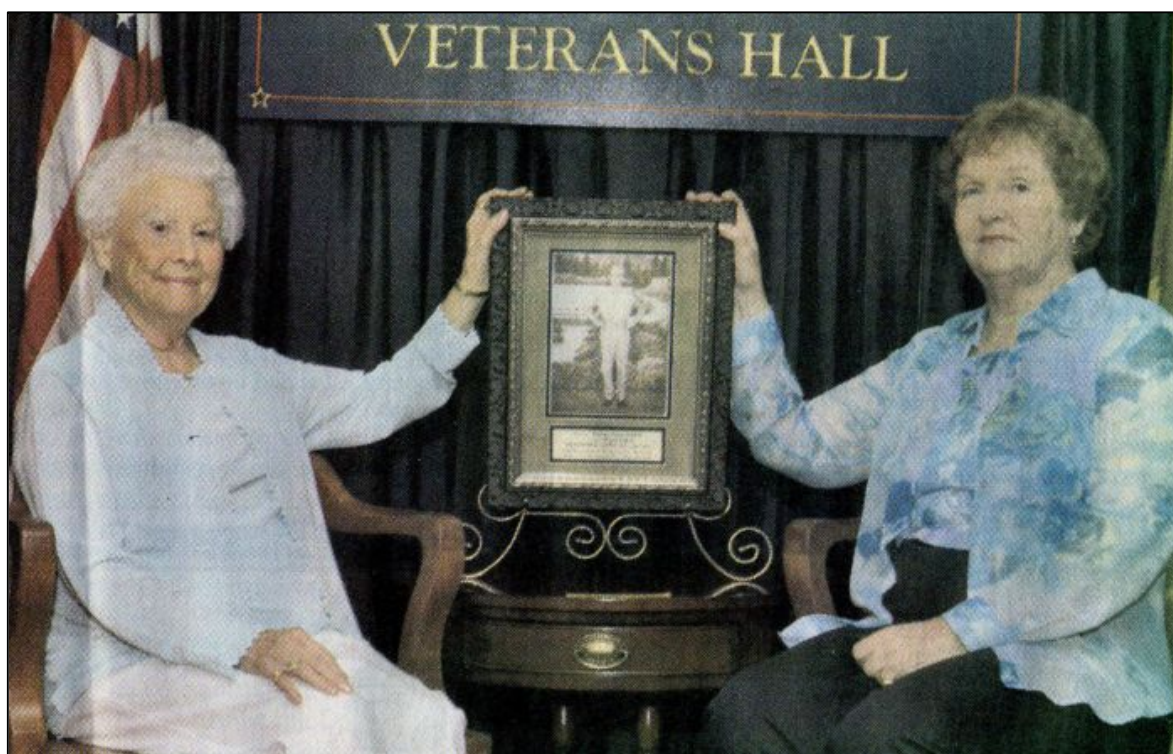

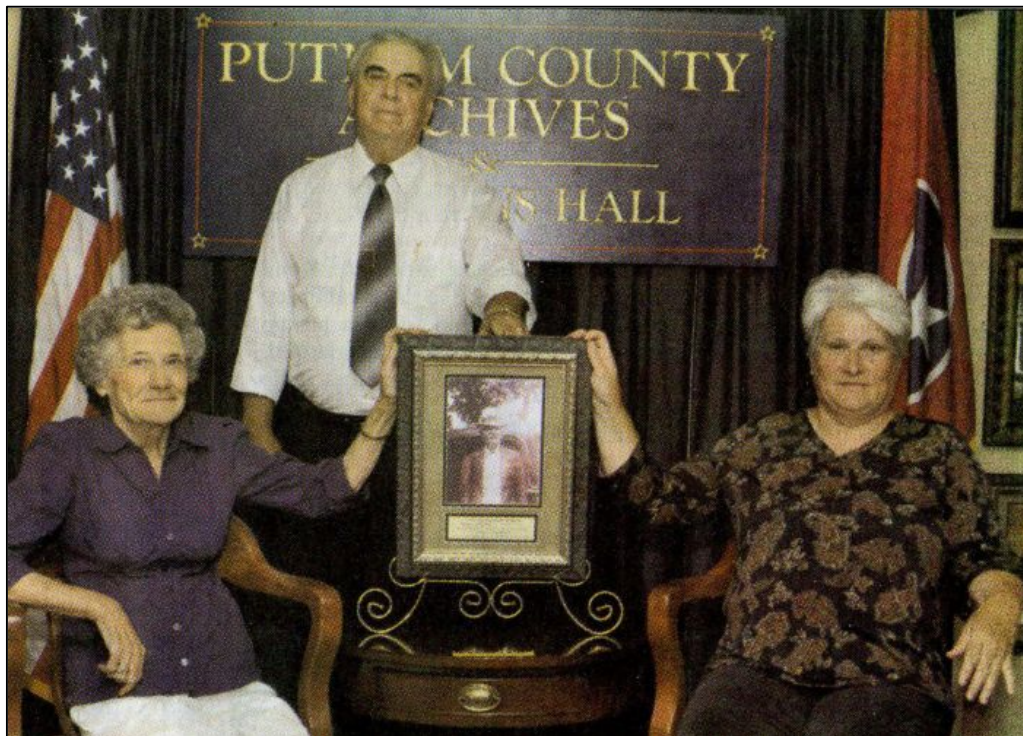

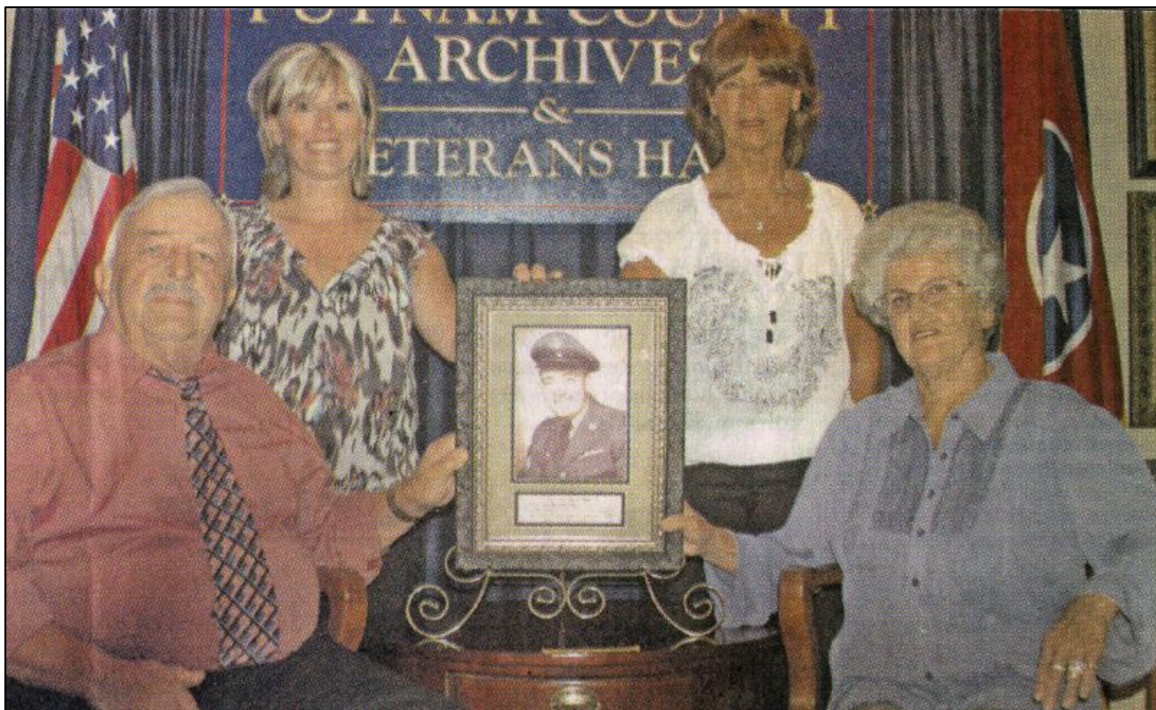

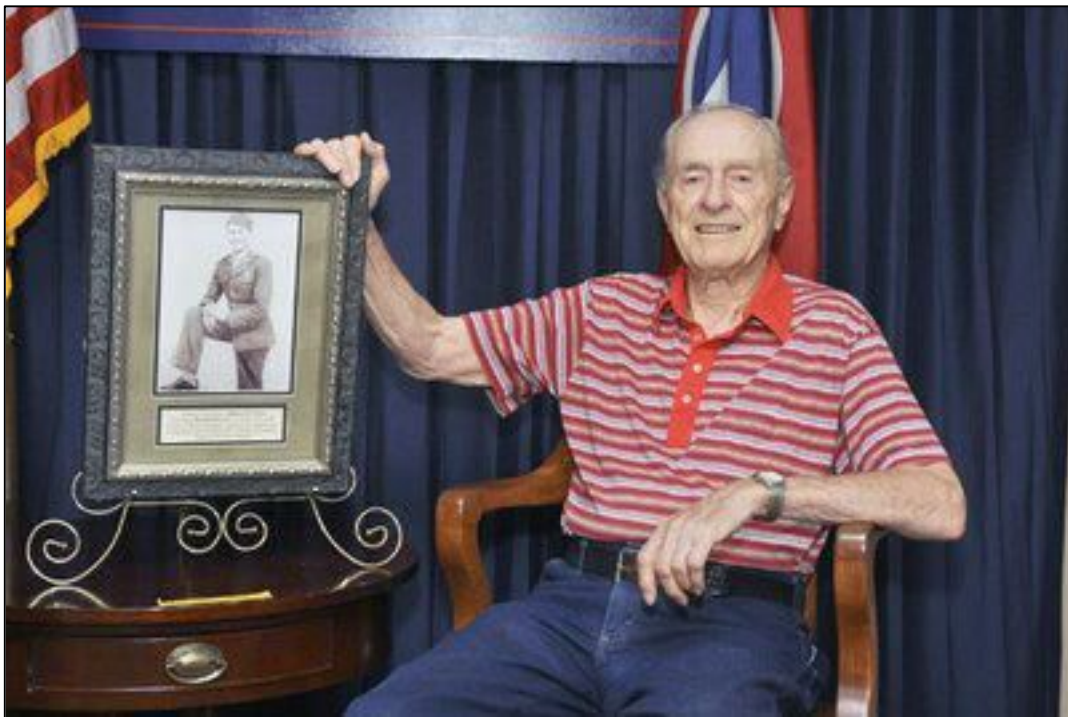

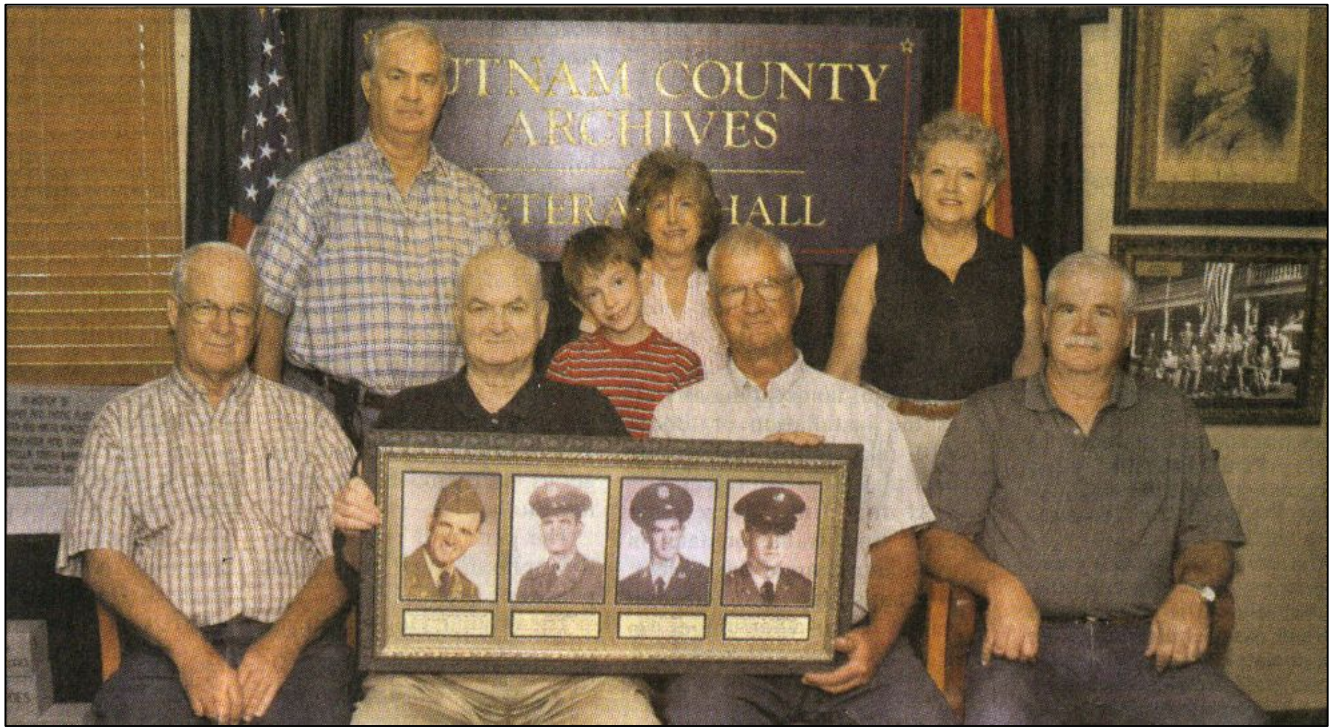
