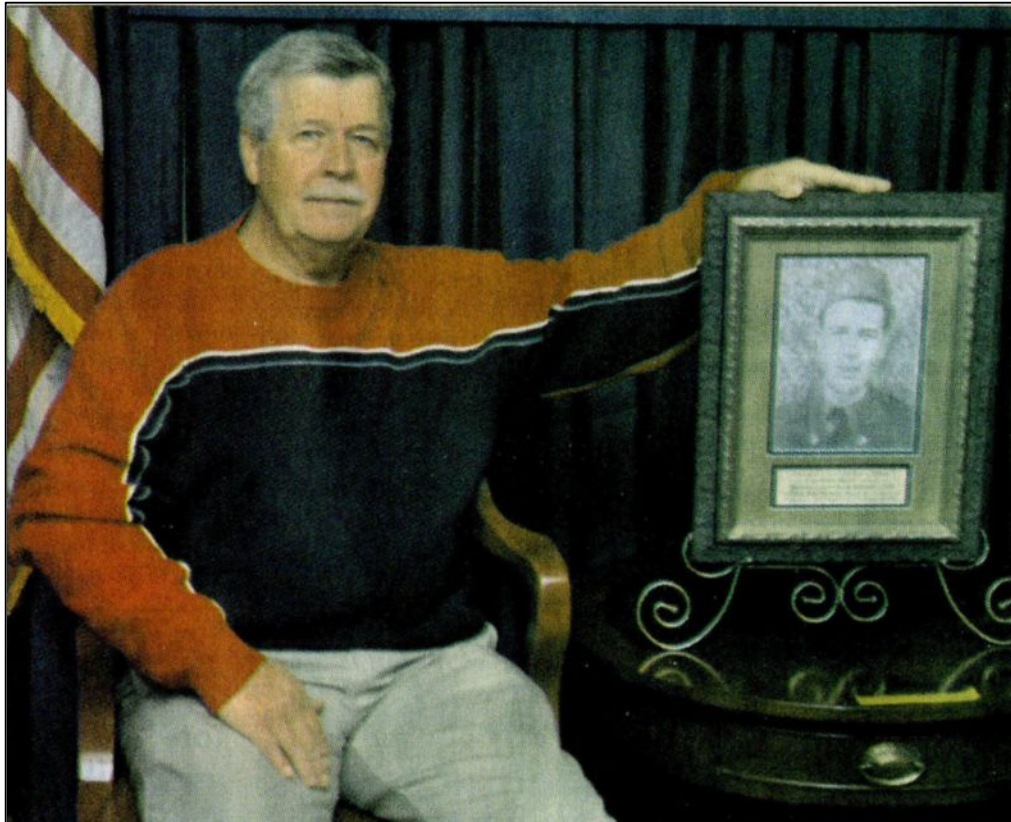

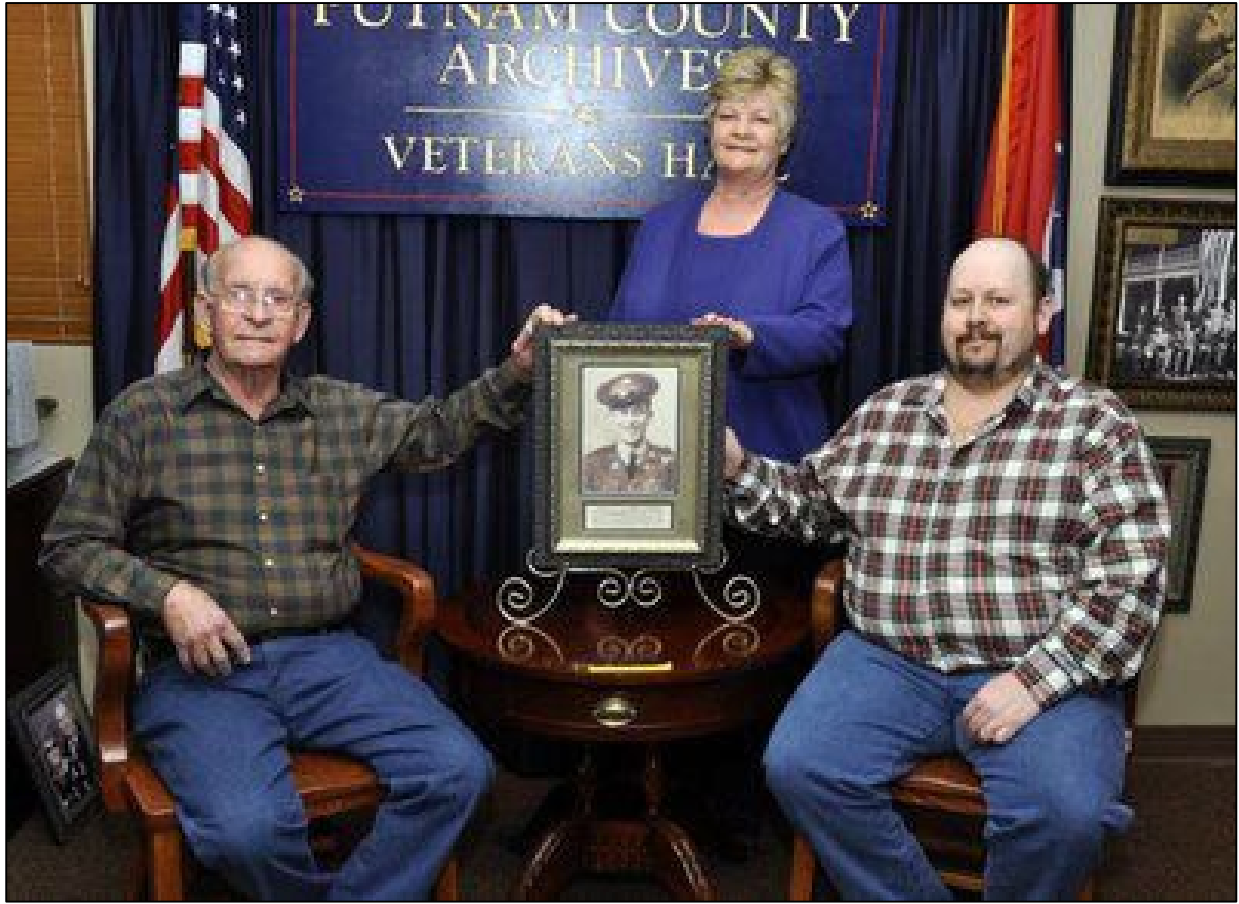

After the war, Reed went to Los Angeles on a GI Bill and studied Aeronautical Engineering and worked in the machining industry with a company who developed the first Jet Engine. He began his own company, S & S Screw Machine in California and brought it back home to Putnam County in 1979. Reed is retired and lives at his home with his wife, Rusty.

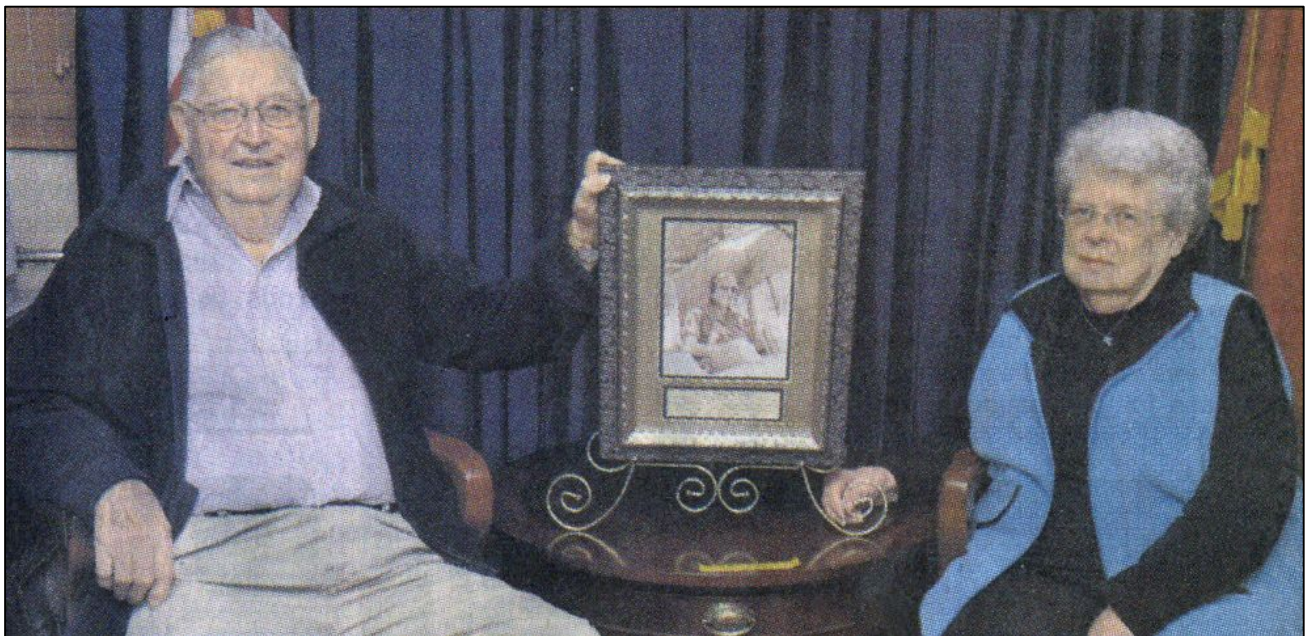




### **ARMY T/5 HORACE B. ROBERSON**

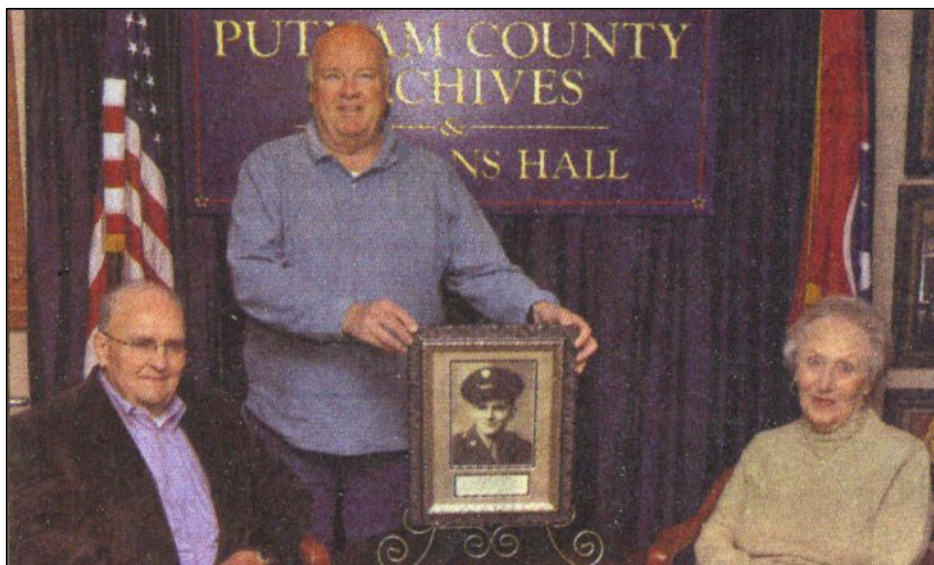

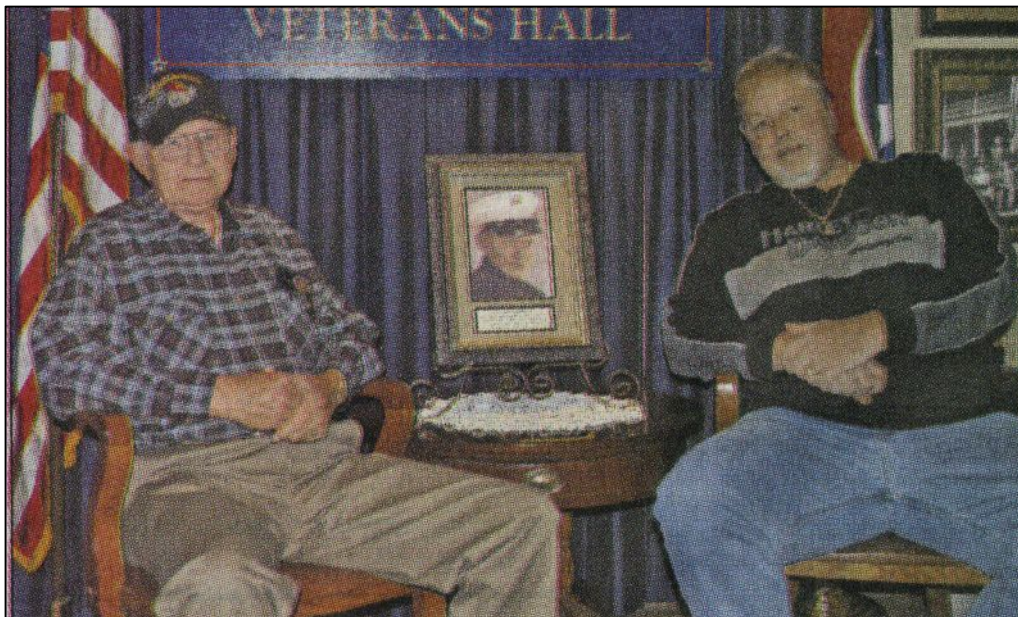

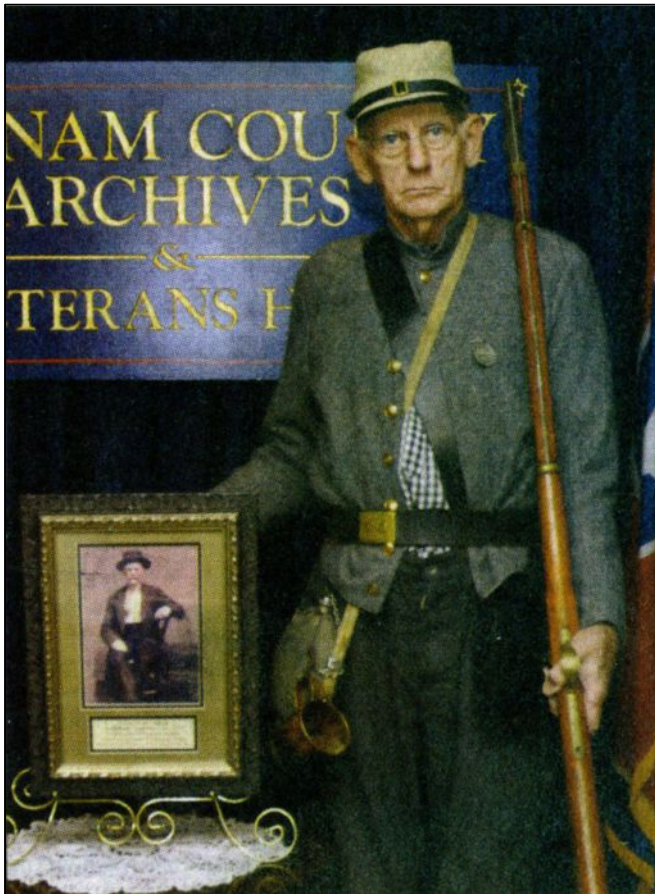
