From its inception in July, 1940 WHUB has been an entertaining and entertainment medium. Those old enough to remember that first decade WHUB was on the air no doubt also remember the songs that melodiously winged their way over the airwaves. A few of these now "old classics" are listed below:

1940: "Tuxedo Junction" and "San Antonio Rose."

1941: "Bluebirds over the White Cliffs of Dover" and "Blues in the Night."

1943: "Coming in on a Wing and a Prayer" and "Oklahoma."

1944: "Don't Fence Me In," "Sentimental Journey," "Swinging on a Star," & "Trolley Song."

1945: "Sioux City Sue," "Cruising Down the River," & "Laura."

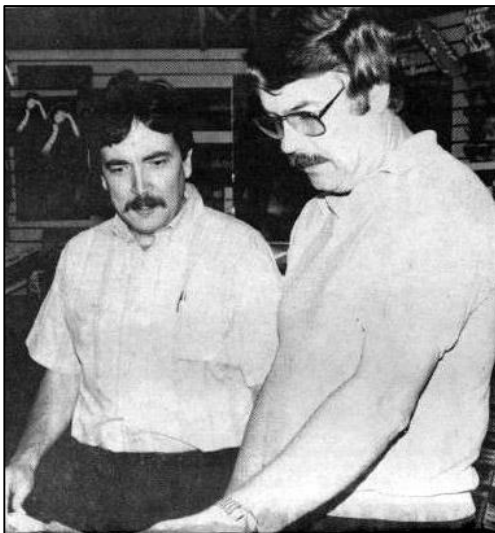
1946: "Girl That I Marry," "Now is the Hour," & "Come Rain or Shine."

1947: "Ballerine," "Beg Your Pardon," & "Near You."

1948: "Buttons and Bows," "Slow Boat to China," & "Manana."

1949: "Bali Hai," "Dear Hearts and Gentle People," "Mockingbird Hill," "Mona Lisa," "Riders in the Sky," "Lucky Old Sun," & "Third Man Theme."
