WHUB Local National Sports

You want sports? WHUB radio has got them, and they've got the all season sports staff to keep you up-to-date with all the play-by-play.

Locally, the station carries broadcasts of Cookeville High Cavalier basketball, football, and, occasionally, baseball. In addition, the station covers the local district and region tournaments in basketball which features teams from all around the Upper Cumberland region.

WHUB provides exclusive coverage of Tennessee Tech football and basketball, and this coverage includes the fat-flung places that the men's and women's teams go in seeking out top-flight Division I competition in the NCAA.

Basketball coverage of the Golden Eagles and Eaglettes has originated from such places as Honolulu, Hawaii, for the Rainbow Basketball Classic, University of Tennessee in Knoxville, Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Florida State University in Tallahassee, the Wichita State University at Berkeley, the Far West Classic at Portland, Oregon, the Rebel Round-up in Las Vegas, Nevada, and San Diego, California.

Football games have originated from such places as Vermillion, South Dakota; Las Vegas, Nevada; Tulsa, Oklahoma; Manhattan, Kansas; Abilene, Texas; Omaha, Nebraska; New Orleans, Louisiana; and to all the Ohio Valley Conference Schools.

Nationally, through the CBS radio network, WHUB has carried the World Series, NCAA basketball playoffs, Super Bowl, baseball games of the week and other sports specials.

WHUB is also the sports station for University of Tennessee basketball and football games, giving extensive coverage to pre-game and post-game comments.

The "Hub of the Upper Cumberland" station also has daily sports updates on the local scene as well as coaches; shows for Tennessee Tech and Cookeville High coaches. These chatty and informal programs give coaches an opportunity to address questions, and fans in the area listen attentively to these comments.

There are also morning and evening full-range sports shows from CBS featuring the latest scores and highlights of events taking place in the sports world.

For forty years, WHUB has originated live sports coverage; another commitment to the community by the area's first radio station.

In addition to the WHUB sports staff of Gene Davison, Eldon Burgess and Mike Dyer, Donnie Cox works with this trio as a support arm in TTU broadcasts.
