4. A Negro Spiritual, "Standing in the Need of Prayer", by the Quartett. (4 minutes)

5. A Solo, "The heavenly Song", by the Rev. Fickelsimer. (4 minutes)

6. "Jesus Savior Pilot Me" by the Quartett. (4 minutes)

7. Theme Song, "Amazing Grace", by the Quartett. (2 min.)

I received this old document from Jim Halliday. He wrote that this typed paper was of a music show broadcast on WHUB "The Voice of the Upper Cumberland" Cookeville, Putnam Co., TN. Feature: A program of sacred music fostered by the Upper Cumberland Baptist Pastors and Ministers Conference, 14 August 1940.

Jim's grandmother, Irene Raper was a member of the quartet of the Doyle Baptist Church, Doyle, TN.

It was back in the 1930's that original owner Luke Medley of Buffalo Valley, Putnam Co., TN set out to build Cookeville's first radio station. By 1940, WHUB had made it to the airwaves – first in a trail broadcast that featured live gospel singing and tunes.
