A 22 year old Cookeville man was killed Saturday afternoon in DeKalb County when his motorcycle crossed the center line into the path of a pickup truck on Highway 56.

The Tennessee Highway patrol reports that Walter Bruce Huddleston, manager of the Kwik Stop Market on South Jefferson in Cookeville, died when his motorcycle and the truck collided. The accident occurred eight miles north of Smithville about 2:45 p.m., the highway patrol said. Trooper John York of Sparta investigated the accident.

Huddleston, who had been working as a manager of the Kwik Stop Market on South Jefferson, also helped to manage the South Willow Kwik Stop Market until the second store opened. His funeral will be at 11 a.m. Tuesday from the Chapel of Hooper and Huddleston Funeral Home.

Rev. Wesley Henry and Rev. Herman Dam will be the officiating ministers. Burial will be in Smellage Cemetery. Survivors include his parents Ted and Carolyn Shanks Huddleston of Silver Point, four brothers, David and Donald, both of Nashville, and Gary and Michael, both of Silver Point, maternal grandfather Luke Shanks of Silver Point, Paternal grandmother, Mrs. Irene Williams of Cookeville.
